10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
12	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an

15	BUILDING OPPORTUNITY THROUGH
16	OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME GRANT PROGRAM
17	Section 1501-N. Scope of article.
18	This article relates to the establishment of the Building
19	Opportunity Through Out-of-School Time Grant Program.
20	Section 1502-N. Definitions.

- 1 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 2 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 3 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 4 <u>"At-risk school-age youth." School-age youth who are at an</u>
- 5 <u>educational disadvantage because of limited English proficiency</u>,
- 6 poverty, homelessness, foster care, housing instability,
- 7 <u>academic difficulties or economic disadvantage.</u>
- 8 "Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and
- 9 <u>Delinquency.</u>
- 10 "Committee." The Building Opportunity Through Out-of-School
- 11 <u>Time Committee established under section 1503-N.</u>
- 12 "Community-based nonprofit organization." A nonprofit
- 13 organization which is qualified for an exemption under 26 U.S.C.
- 14 § 501(c)(3) (relating to exemption from tax on corporations,
- 15 certain trusts, etc.) and provides out-of-school time
- 16 programming to school-age youth.
- 17 <u>"Eliqible provider."</u> The term:
- 18 (1) Includes any of the following entities:
- 19 <u>(i) A community-based nonprofit organization that is</u>
- 20 not a member of a Statewide youth-serving nonprofit
- 21 organization.
- 22 (ii) A Statewide youth-serving nonprofit.
- 23 <u>(iii) A school entity.</u>
- 24 (2) Does not include any provider licensed under 55 Pa.
- 25 <u>Code Ch. 3270 (relating to child care centers), 3280</u>
- 26 (relating to group child care homes) or 3290 (relating to
- family child care homes).
- 28 "Fund." The Building Opportunity Through Out-of-School Time
- 29 Fund established under section 1504-N(i).
- 30 "Out-of-school time programming." Structured programs or

1	activities that meet all of the following:
2	(1) To the extent practicable, are led by engaged adult
3	mentors using evidence-based or evidence-informed practices
4	and are provided to school-age youth before school, after
5	school or during the summer.
6	(2) Neither include nor in any way supplant
7	instructional services provided by school entity employees.
8	(3) Neither satisfy compulsory education requirements
9	nor result in academic credit for students.
10	(4) Relate to one or more of the following:
11	(i) Improving social, emotional, academic or career-
12	readiness competencies.
13	(ii) Preventing and reducing teenage pregnancies.
14	(iii) Reducing negative behaviors, including
15	violence and crime, tobacco use, alcohol and substance
16	abuse, disengagement from school, school suspension,
17	truancy and health-compromising behaviors.
18	(iv) Providing a safe out-of-school time
19	environment.
20	(v) Engaging in career exploration or formal or
21	informal work-based learning.
22	(vi) Any other offerings approved by the committee.
23	"Program." The Building Opportunity Through Out-of-School
24	Time Grant Program established under section 1504-N.
25	"School entity." A school district or area career and
26	technical school.
27	"School-age youth." Children attending a public or nonpublic
28	kindergarten, elementary school or secondary school at which the
29	compulsory attendance requirements of the Commonwealth may be

1	"Statewide youth-serving nonprofit." A Statewide association
2	that meets all of the following:
3	(1) Is qualified for an exemption under 26 U.S.C. §
4	501(c)(4).
5	(2) Serves community-based nonprofit organizations.
6	(3) Is affiliated and in good standing with a nationally
7	recognized nonprofit.
8	(4) Provides facility based out-of-school time
9	programming designed for recreational, educational and
10	character-building purposes for school-age youth.
11	Section 1503-N. Building Opportunity Through Out-of-School Time
12	Committee.
13	(a) Establishment The Building Opportunity Through Out-of-
14	School Time Committee is established within the commission.
15	(b) Composition The committee shall consist of the
16	<pre>following members:</pre>
17	(1) The chairperson of the commission, or a designee.
18	(2) The Secretary of Education, or a designee.
19	(3) The Secretary of Human Services, or a designee.
20	(4) An individual appointed by the President pro tempore
21	of the Senate.
22	(5) An individual appointed by the Minority Leader of
23	the Senate.
24	(6) An individual appointed by the Speaker of the House
25	of Representatives.
26	(7) An individual appointed by the Minority Leader of

28	the House of Representatives. (8) The following members appointed by the Governor:

2	(ii) Three individuals from different community-
3	based nonprofit organizations from geographically diverse
4	<u>areas.</u>
5	(iii) A child psychologist who specializes in
6	mental, social and emotional development of children
7	recommended by the Pennsylvania Psychological
8	Association.
9	(iv) A licensed clinical social worker recommended
10	by the Pennsylvania Society for Clinical Social Work.
11	(v) An individual recommended by the Pennsylvania
12	Association of School Administrators.
13	(vi) An individual recommended by the Pennsylvania
14	Court Appointed Special Advocates Association.
15	(c) Chairperson The chairperson of the committee shall be
16	the chairperson of the commission or the chairperson's designee.
17	(d) Vice chairperson A vice chairperson shall be
18	designated by the chairperson of the committee from among the
19	members of the committee to preside at meetings in the absence
20	of the chairperson.
21	(e) TermMembers of the committee shall serve a four-year
22	term.
23	(f) Quorum A majority of the members of the committee
24	present shall constitute a quorum, and a quorum shall be
25	required for all actions.
26	(g) Initial meeting The committee shall hold its first
27	meeting no later than 60 days from the effective date of this
28	subsection.
29	(h) Cooperation The commission shall cooperate with the
30	committee to select staff to be employed by the commission and

- 3 Section 1504-N. Building Opportunity Through Out-of-School Time
- 4 <u>Grant Program.</u>
- 5 (a) Establishment. -- The Building Opportunity Through Out-of-
- 6 School Time Grant Program is established to expand out-of-school
- 7 time programming opportunities for school-age youth.
- 8 (b) Functions generally. -- The committee shall perform all
- 9 <u>functions related to the direct approval</u>, <u>disbursement and</u>
- 10 administration of grants under the program.
- 11 (c) Applications. -- The committee shall prescribe the form
- 12 and manner in which an eligible provider may submit an
- 13 application to receive a grant award under the program. The
- 14 committee shall accept applications annually using money
- 15 available in the fund.
- 16 (d) Diversity. -- The committee shall ensure that grant
- 17 funding under the program is geographically dispersed to
- 18 eliqible providers throughout this Commonwealth.
- 19 (e) Supplemental.--Grant money allocated through the program
- 20 shall be used to supplement existing spending on out-of-school
- 21 time programming. Nothing shall preclude an eligible provider
- 22 from making an application in a subsequent year for the same
- 23 purpose and amount awarded in a prior year.
- 24 (f) Effect of revenue received. -- Grant money received by a
- 25 school entity under this section may not be included when
- 26 calculating the amount to be paid to a charter school under
- 27 <u>section 1725-A.</u>
- 28 (g) Limitations. -- All grants must be made in accordance with
- 29 the following:
- 30 (1) The committee may establish appropriate parameters

- for grant award amounts that may include per-student grant
- 2 award rates with additional allocations permitted for special
- 3 populations or delivery models.
- 4 (2) Eligible providers may use up to 5% of a grant award
- 5 <u>under the program for administrative costs associated with</u>
- 6 the program.
- 7 (3) Not more than 40% of the fund shall be awarded
- 8 <u>annually to Statewide youth-serving nonprofit organizations.</u>
- 9 (4) Beginning in the 2024-2025 fiscal year, not more
- than 10% of the fund shall be awarded annually to school
- 11 <u>entities.</u>
- 12 (5) A school entity shall not be eligible for funding
- 13 <u>under this article until the 2024-2025 fiscal year.</u>
- 14 (6) The committee, in its discretion, may award, in
- whole or in part, a request made by an eligible provider in
- the provider's grant application.
- 17 (h) Sustainability planning. -- Sustainability planning is not
- 18 a necessary component of an application under this section. The
- 19 following shall apply:
- 20 (1) Notwithstanding subsection (k), the committee shall
- 21 prioritize maintaining grant awards under the program for the
- 22 same purpose and amount as eliqible providers received in the
- 23 prior year if the eligible provider demonstrated satisfactory
- 24 compliance with the provisions of the program.
- 25 (2) The provisions of paragraph (1) may not apply to an
- 26 eligible provider seeking a fourth consecutive grant award
- 27 <u>under the program.</u>
- 28 (i) Building Opportunity Through Out-of-School Time Fund. --
- 29 (1) The Building Opportunity Through Out-of-School Time
- Fund is established as a nonlapsing fund in the State

- 1 <u>Treasury.</u>
- 2 (2) All money deposited into the fund and the interest
- 3 it accrues are appropriated to the commission on a continuing
- 4 <u>basis to award grants under this article.</u>
- 5 (3) No administrative action shall prevent the deposit
- of money into the fund in the fiscal year in which the money
- 7 is received.
- 8 <u>(4) The fund may only be used for the grant program</u>
- 9 <u>authorized under this article</u>, and no money in the fund may
- be transferred or diverted to any other purpose by
- 11 <u>administrative action.</u>
- 12 (5) Money available to the fund shall include
- 13 <u>appropriations and transfers from the General Fund, special</u>
- 14 funds, Federal funds and other sources of revenue made
- 15 available to the fund.
- 16 (6) Grants under this section shall be awarded no later
- 17 than March 1, 2024, and each November 1 thereafter.
- 18 (j) Specific purposes. -- The committee shall provide grants
- 19 from the fund to eligible providers for out-of-school time
- 20 programming. The following shall apply:
- 21 (1) The commission may use up to 2% of the money
- appropriated from the fund to the commission for the program
- 23 to carry out the provisions of this article.
- 24 (2) The committee shall ensure that the funding
- 25 announcement and grant application are constructed such that
- 26 eligible providers may remain eligible for Federal TANF
- funding.
- 28 (k) Prioritization of grants. -- Grant applications shall be
- 29 prioritized as follows:
- 30 (1) The committee may prioritize grant awards under the

riteria:
(i) Serve the highest number or the highest
percentage of at-risk school-age youth, students
experiencing homelessness, foster care youth and students
with a disability as defined in 22 Pa. Code § 14.101
(relating to definitions).
(ii) Reduce barriers to access, including
transportation and enrollment costs, for at-risk school-
age youth and students with a disability as defined in 22
Pa. Code § 14.101.
(iii) Demonstrate a commitment to serve and increase
access for historically underrepresented and underserved
school-age youth.
(iv) Develop and maintain community coordination and
partnerships.
(v) Engage the prospective school-age youth
participants and other stakeholders in the development
and implementation of out-of-school time programming.
(vi) Integrate trauma-informed approaches into the
program curriculum and the professional development
curriculum of personnel of the eligible provider who have
regular contact with school-age youth.
(vii) Any other criteria approved by the committee.
(2) The committee shall provide guidance in the funding
nnouncement detailing the specific criteria which the
ommittee intends to prioritize when making grant awards
nder the program.
l) Training The committee shall conduct informational
ning for eligible providers outlining the grant priorities

- 1 and completion of applications.
- 2 (m) Technical assistance. -- The committee may use any portion
- 3 of the allotment under subsection (j) to contract with a third
- 4 party to provide technical assistance for eligible providers
- 5 that receive a grant award under the program.
- 6 (n) Nondiscrimination. -- Eligible providers awarded grants
- 7 under this article may not discriminate against individuals or
- 8 groups by reason of race, color, familial status, religious
- 9 creed, ancestry, age, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity
- 10 or expression, national origin, handicap or disability or use of
- 11 guide or support animals because of the blindness, deafness or
- 12 physical handicap of the user or because the user is a handler
- 13 <u>or trainer of support or guide animals.</u>
- 14 (o) Audits. -- Audits shall be conducted in accordance with
- 15 the following:
- 16 (1) The commission may randomly audit and monitor grant
- 17 recipients under the program to ensure the appropriate use of
- 18 grant money under the program and compliance with the
- 19 provisions of subsection (d).
- 20 (2) The Auditor General may not perform audits related
- 21 <u>to grant applications.</u>
- 22 (p) Performance metrics. -- The committee shall include
- 23 performance metrics to measure the progress of grants awarded
- 24 under the program.
- 25 (g) Report.--By March 1, 2024, and each November 1
- 26 thereafter, the commission shall post on its publicly accessible
- 27 Internet website a report to include:
- 28 (1) A summary by the eligible provider of the grant
- award amount, a description of the proposed grant award use,
- 30 the estimated number of school-age youth to be served by the

- 1 grant award, the estimated number of at-risk school-age youth
- 2 to be served by the grant award and the estimated average
- 3 per-student fee charged by an eligible provider to
- 4 participate in out-of-school time programming supported by a
- 5 grant award under the program.
- 6 (2) A summary of the amount and use of the
- 7 <u>administrative costs permitted under subsection (j)(1).</u>
- 8 <u>Section 1505-N. Registry.</u>
- 9 (a) Searchable registry. -- The commission shall annually
- 10 maintain a searchable registry on its publicly accessible
- 11 Internet website of eligible providers of out-of-school time
- 12 programming that opt in to being included.
- 13 (b) Process. -- The committee shall establish a process by
- 14 which eligible providers may opt in to being listed in the
- 15 registry under subsection (a).
- 16 Section 1506-N. Construction.
- 17 Nothing in this article shall supersede or preempt any
- 18 provision of a collective bargaining agreement between a school
- 19 entity and an employee organization.
- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023, or
- 21 immediately, whichever is later.
