- Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in particular rights and 1 2 immunities, further providing for emergency response provider 3 and bystander good Samaritan civil immunity. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Section 8332(d) of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by adding subsections to read: 10 Emergency response provider and bystander good 11 Samaritan civil immunity. 12 (a.1) Police animals. -- An emergency response provider, who has completed training as required under subsection (b.1), and

- 15 who in good faith renders emergency care, treatment, first aid
- 16 or rescue to a police animal at the scene of an emergency event
- or crime shall not be liable for any civil damages as a result 17

- 2 omissions which result in harm to the police animal receiving

- 4 (b.1) Training. -- For purposes of subsection (a.1), an
