AN ACT

- Amending the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), entitled "An act relating to dogs, regulating the keeping of dogs; providing for the licensing of dogs and kennels; providing for the protection of dogs and the detention and destruction of dogs in certain cases; regulating the sale and 5 transportation of dogs; declaring dogs to be personal 6 property and the subject of theft; providing for the 7 8 abandonment of animals; providing for the assessment of damages done to animals; providing for payment of damages by 9 the Commonwealth in certain cases and the liability of the owner or keeper of dogs for such damages; imposing powers and 10 11 duties on certain State and local officers and employees; 12 providing penalties; and creating a Dog Law Restricted 13 Account," in dangerous dogs, further providing for court 14 proceedings, certificate of registration and disposition; and 15 providing for muzzled dogs. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 18 19 Section 1. Section 502-A(a)(2) of the act of December 7, 20 1982 (P.L. 784, No. 225), known as the Dog Law, is amended to 2.1 read: Section 502-A. Court proceedings, certificate of registration 22 23 and disposition.
- 24 (a) Summary offense of harboring a dangerous dog.--Any

- 1 person who has been attacked by one or more dogs, or anyone on
- 2 behalf of the person, a person whose domestic animal, dog or cat
- 3 has been killed or injured without provocation, the State dog
- 4 warden or the local police officer may file a complaint before a
- 5 magisterial district judge, charging the owner or keeper of the
- 6 a dog with harboring a dangerous dog. The owner or keeper of the
- 7 dog shall be guilty of the summary offense of harboring a
- 8 dangerous dog if the magisterial district judge finds beyond a
- 9 reasonable doubt that the following elements of the offense have
- 10 been proven:

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- 12 (2) The dog has either or both of the following:
- 13 (i) A history of attacking human beings and/or
- or more determinations under Article V-B that the dog is-

- 25 Section 2. The act is amended by adding an article to read:
- 26 <u>ARTICLE V-B</u>
- 27 <u>MUZZLED DOGS</u>
- 28 <u>Section 501-B. Court proceedings and disposition.</u>
- 29 <u>(a) Summary offense of harboring a muzzled dog. Any person</u> <--
- 30 who has been attacked by one or more dogs on public or private

Τ	property, or anyone on behalf of the person, a person whose dog
2	or cat has been killed or injured without provocation, the State
3	dog warden or a local police officer may file a complaint before
4	a magisterial district judge charging the owner or keeper of the
5	dog or dogs with harboring a muzzled dog. The owner or keeper of
6	the dog or dogs shall be guilty of the summary offense of
7	harboring a muzzled dog if the magisterial district judge finds
8	beyond a reasonable doubt that the following elements of the
9	offense have been proven:
10	(1) The dog has done any of the following:
11	(i) Killed or inflicted severe injury on a human
12	being without provocation on public or private property.
13	(ii) Killed or inflicted severe injury on a dog or
14	cat without provocation while off of the owner's or
15	keeper's property.
16	(2) The defendant is the owner or keeper of the dog.
17	(b) Effect of conviction A finding by a magisterial
18	district judge that a person is guilty under subsection (a) of
19	harboring a muzzled dog shall constitute a determination that
20	the dog is a muzzled dog for the purposes of this act.
21	(c) Report of conviction. The magisterial district judge
22	shall make a report of a conviction under subsection (a) to the
23	Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement, identifying the convicted party,
24	identifying and describing the dog or dogs and providing other
25	information as the bureau might reasonably require.
26	Section 502 B. Requirements.
27	(a) Compliance requirements. The owner or keeper of a dog
28	who has been convicted of harboring a muzzled dog shall do all
29	of the following:
30	(1) Present sufficient evidence of a proper enclosure to

1	confine a muzzled dog.
2	(2) When individuals who are not members of the owner's
3	or keeper's household are present as invitees on the premises
4	or in the dwelling of the owner or keeper of the muzzled dog,
5	<u>either:</u>
6	(i) confine the muzzled dog in the proper enclosure;
7	or
8	(ii) muzzle the muzzled dog and keep the dog under
9	the physical restraint of a responsible person.
10	(3) While the muzzled dog is on public property or on
11	private property that is not the owner's or keeper's
12	property, muzzle the muzzled dog and keep the dog under the
13	physical restraint of a responsible person.
14	(4) Post the premises with a clearly visible warning
15	sign that there is a muzzled dog on the property.
16	(5) Conspicuously display a sign with a warning symbol
17	that informs children of the presence of a muzzled dog.
18	(6) Pay court ordered restitution to a victim of a
19	muzzled dog.
20	(b) Uniform identifiable symbol. The department shall have
21	the authority to establish a uniform identifiable symbol for
22	<u>visual recognition of muzzled dogs.</u>
23	(c) Other requirement. A new owner or keeper of the muzzled
24	dog shall be required to comply with the provisions of this
25	article and regulations pertaining to a muzzled dog.
26	Section 503 B. Control of muzzled dogs.
27	(a) Prohibitions. It is unlawful for an owner or keeper of
28	a muzzled dog to permit the muzzled dog to be:
29	(1) Outside the proper enclosure while individuals who
30	are not members of the owner's or keeper's household are

1	present as an invitees on the premises or in the dwelling of
2	the owner or keeper unless the dog is muzzled and under the
3	physical restraint of a responsible person.
4	(2) On public property or on private property that is
5	not the owner's or keeper's premises or dwelling unless the
6	dog is muzzled and under the physical restraint of a
7	<u>responsible person.</u>
8	(b) Requirement. The muzzle shall be made in a manner that
9	will not cause injury to the dog nor interfere with its vision
10	or respiration but shall prevent it from biting a person or
11	animal or from destroying property with its teeth.
12	Section 504 B. Public safety and penalties.
13	(a) Failure to restrain. The owner or keeper of a muzzled
14	dog who fails to comply with the provisions of section 502-B and
15	section 503-B commits a misdemeanor of the third degree.
16	(b) Subsequent violations. The owner or keeper of a muzzled
17	dog who commits a subsequent violation under subsection (a)
18	commits a misdemeanor of the second degree and, upon conviction,
19	shall pay a fine not to exceed \$2,500.
20	(c) Utilization of fines. All fines collected under this
21	section shall be deposited into the Dog Law Restricted Account
22	and may be utilized to pay the expenses of the department in
23	administering its duties under this act.
24	(d) Collection. In cases of inability to collect the fine
25	assessed or failure of an owner or keeper to pay all or a
26	portion of the fine, the secretary may refer the matter to the
27	Office of Attorney General, which shall institute an action in
28	the appropriate court to recover the fine.
29	(e) Attacks by a muzzled dog.
30	(1) If a muzzled dog, through the intentional, reckless

Τ.	or negrigent conduct of the dog 5 owner of keeper, actacks a
2	human being on the dog owner's or keeper's property, the
3	dog's owner or keeper shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the
4	second degree.
5	(2) If a muzzled dog, through the intentional, reckless
6	or negligent conduct of the dog's owner or keeper,
7	aggressively attacks and causes severe injury or death of a
8	human being on the dog owner's or keeper's property, the dog
9	owner or keeper shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the first
_0	degree.
1	(f) Mandatory reporting.
_2	(1) All known incidents of dog attacks shall be reported
_3	to the county's State dog warden, who shall investigate each
4	incident and notify the department if a dog has been
_5	determined to be a muzzled dog.
- 6	(2) A State dog warden or police officer who has
_7	knowledge of a dog which has attacked a person shall file a
8 ـ	written report summarizing the circumstances of the attack
9	with the police in the municipality where the owner of the
20	dog resides or if the attack occurred outside the owner's
21	municipality of residence, with the police having
22	jurisdiction in the municipality where the attack occurred.
23	The report shall be available for public inspection.
24	Section 505 B. Construction of article.
25	(a) Enforcement. This article shall be enforced by all
26	municipalities, except counties.
27	(b) Abusive or unlawful conduct of victim. This article
28	shall not apply if the injury was sustained by a person who, at
29	the time, was committing a willful trespass or other tort upon
30	the premises occupied by the owner or keeper of the dog, or was

1	tormenting, abusing or assaulting the dog or has, in the past,
2	been observed or reported to have tormented, abused or assaulted
3	the dog, or was committing or attempting to commit a crime.
4	(c) Farm dogs. No farmer who owns a dog kept on the farm
5	shall be guilty of keeping a muzzled dog if the farm is
6	conspicuously posted alerting visitors to the presence of a
7	watch or guard dog at all points of ingress and egress.
8	(d) Procedure in certain cities. In cities of the first
9	class, second class and second class A, the following procedure
_0	shall apply:
1	(1) A person who has been attacked without provocation
.2	by a dog on the dog owner's or keeper's property, or anyone
13	on behalf of the person or a police officer or an animal
4	control officer employed by or under contract with the city
.5	may make a complaint before a magisterial district judge,
-6	charging the owner or keeper of the dog with harboring a
_7	muzzled dog. The magisterial district judge shall make a
8_	report of the determination under section 501-B(a) to the
_9	police or an animal control officer employed by or under
20	contract with the city and to the Bureau of Dog Law
21	Enforcement.
22	(2) Enforcement of this article in cities of the first
23	class, second class and second class A will be under the
24	jurisdiction of the local police or an animal control officer
25	employed by or under contract with the city.
26	(3) Copies of all muzzled dog determinations and reports
27	on the status of the muzzled dog shall be sent to the Bureau
28	of Dog Law Enforcement.
29	(4) All known incidents of attacks by muzzled dogs shall
30	be reported to the department for the purpose of keeping bite

- 13 <u>(5) A LOCAL POLICE OFFICER.</u>
- 14 (B) PERSONS SUBJECT TO MUZZLED DOG ORDER.--A PERSON SHALL BE
- 15 SUBJECT TO A MUZZLED DOG ORDER IF A MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT JUDGE
- 16 FINDS BY A PREPONDERANCE OF THE EVIDENCE THAT THE DOG HAS KILLED
- 17 OR INFLICTED SEVERE INJURY ON:
- 18 (1) A HUMAN BEING WITHOUT PROVOCATION ON PUBLIC OR
- 19 PRIVATE PROPERTY; OR

- 27 <u>(D) REPORT OF MUZZLED DOG ORDER.--THE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT</u>

- 3 (A) COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS. -- THE OWNER OR KEEPER OF A DOG

- 5 SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 6 (1) PRESENT SUFFICIENT EVIDENCE OF A PROPER ENCLOSURE TO
- 7 CONFINE THE MUZZLED DOG.
- 8 (2) WHEN INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS OF THE OWNER'S
- 9 OR KEEPER'S HOUSEHOLD ARE PRESENT AS INVITEES ON THE PREMISES
- 10 OR IN THE DWELLING OF THE OWNER OR KEEPER OF THE MUZZLED DOG,
- 11 <u>EITHER:</u>

- 20 (4) POST THE PREMISES WITH A CLEARLY VISIBLE WARNING
- 21 SIGN THAT THERE IS A MUZZLED DOG ON THE PROPERTY.
- 22 (5) CONSPICUOUSLY DISPLAY A SIGN WITH A WARNING SYMBOL
- 23 THAT INFORMS CHILDREN OF THE PRESENCE OF A MUZZLED DOG.
- 24 (B) UNIFORM IDENTIFIABLE SYMBOL. -- THE DEPARTMENT MAY
- 25 ESTABLISH A UNIFORM IDENTIFIABLE SYMBOL FOR VISUAL RECOGNITION
- 26 OF MUZZLED DOGS.
- 27 (C) OTHER REQUIREMENT. -- A NEW OWNER OR KEEPER OF THE MUZZLED
- 28 DOG SHALL BE REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
- 29 ARTICLE AND REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO A MUZZLED DOG.
- 30 <u>SECTION 503-B. CONTROL OF MUZZLED DOGS.</u>

- 1 (A) PROHIBITION.--IT IS UNLAWFUL FOR AN OWNER OR KEEPER OF A
- 2 MUZZLED DOG TO PERMIT THE MUZZLED DOG TO BE:
- 3 (1) OUTSIDE THE PROPER ENCLOSURE WHILE INDIVIDUALS WHO
- 4 ARE NOT MEMBERS OF THE OWNER'S OR KEEPER'S HOUSEHOLD ARE
- 5 PRESENT AS INVITEES ON THE PREMISES OR IN THE DWELLING OF THE
- OWNER OR KEEPER, UNLESS THE MUZZLED DOG IS MUZZLED AND KEPT
- 7 UNDER THE PHYSICAL RESTRAINT OF A RESPONSIBLE PERSON.
- 8 (2) ON PUBLIC PROPERTY OR ON PRIVATE PROPERTY THAT IS
- 9 <u>NOT THE OWNER'S OR KEEPER'S PREMISES OR DWELLING, UNLESS THE</u>
- 10 MUZZLED DOG IS MUZZLED AND KEPT UNDER THE PHYSICAL RESTRAINT
- OF A RESPONSIBLE PERSON.
- 12 (B) REQUIREMENT.--THE MUZZLE SHALL BE MADE IN A MANNER THAT
- 13 <u>WILL NOT CAUSE INJURY TO THE MUZZLED DOG OR INTERFERE WITH THE</u>
- 14 <u>VISION OR RESPIRATION OF THE MUZZLED DOG BUT SHALL PREVENT THE</u>
- 15 MUZZLED DOG FROM BITING A PERSON OR ANIMAL OR FROM DESTROYING
- 16 PROPERTY WITH THE MUZZLED DOG'S TEETH.
- 17 SECTION 504-B. PUBLIC SAFETY OFFENSES.
- 18 (A) (RESERVED).
- 19 (B) ATTACK BY MUZZLED DOG.--
- 20 (1) IF A MUZZLED DOG, THROUGH THE INTENTIONAL RECKLESS
- 21 OR NEGLIGENT CONDUCT OF THE OWNER OR KEEPER OF THE MUZZLED
- 22 DOG, ATTACKS A HUMAN ON THE OWNER'S OR KEEPER'S PROPERTY,
- 23 PUBLIC PROPERTY OR PRIVATE PROPERTY THAT IS NOT THE OWNER'S
- OR KEEPER'S PREMISES, THE OWNER OR KEEPER SHALL BE GUILTY OF
- 25 A MISDEMEANOR OF THE SECOND DEGREE.
- 26 (2) IF A MUZZLED DOG, THROUGH THE INTENTIONAL RECKLESS
- OR NEGLIGENT CONDUCT OF THE OWNER OR KEEPER OF THE MUZZLED
- 28 DOG, AGGRESSIVELY ATTACKS AND CAUSES SEVERE INJURY OR DEATH
- ON A HUMAN ON THE OWNER'S OR KEEPER'S PROPERTY, PUBLIC
- 30 PROPERTY OR PRIVATE PROPERTY THAT IS NOT THE OWNER'S OR

- 1 KEEPER'S PREMISES, THE OWNER OR KEEPER SHALL BE GUILTY OF A
- 2 MISDEMEANOR OF THE FIRST DEGREE.
- 3 (C) UTILIZATION OF FINES. -- ALL FINES COLLECTED UNDER THIS
- 4 SECTION SHALL BE DEPOSITED INTO THE DOG LAW RESTRICTED ACCOUNT
- 5 AND MAY BE UTILIZED TO PAY THE EXPENSES OF THE DEPARTMENT IN
- 6 ADMINISTERING THE DEPARTMENT'S DUTIES UNDER THIS ACT.
- 7 (D) COLLECTION. -- IN CASES OF INABILITY TO COLLECT THE FINE
- 8 ASSESSED OR FAILURE OF AN OWNER OR KEEPER OF A MUZZLED DOG TO
- 9 PAY ALL OR A PORTION OF THE FINE, THE SECRETARY MAY REFER THE
- 10 MATTER TO THE OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GENERAL WHICH SHALL INSTITUTE
- 11 AN ACTION IN THE APPROPRIATE COURT TO RECOVER THE FINE.
- 12 (E) MANDATORY REPORTING. --
- 13 (1) ALL KNOWN INCIDENTS OF DOG ATTACKS SHALL BE REPORTED
- 14 TO THE COUNTY'S STATE DOG WARDEN WHO SHALL INVESTIGATE EACH
- 15 <u>INCIDENT AND NOTIFY THE DEPARTMENT IF A DOG HAS BEEN</u>
- 16 DETERMINED TO BE A MUZZLED DOG.
- 17 (2) A STATE DOG WARDEN OR POLICE OFFICER WHO HAS
- 18 KNOWLEDGE OF A DOG WHICH HAS ATTACKED A PERSON SHALL FILE A
- 19 WRITTEN REPORT SUMMARIZING THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE ATTACK
- 20 WITH THE POLICE IN THE MUNICIPALITY WHERE THE OWNER OF THE
- 21 DOG RESIDES OR, IF THE ATTACK OCCURRED OUTSIDE THE OWNER'S
- 22 MUNICIPALITY OF RESIDENCE, WITH THE POLICE HAVING
- JURISDICTION IN THE MUNICIPALITY WHERE THE ATTACK OCCURRED.
- 24 THE REPORT SHALL BE AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION.
- 25 SECTION 505-B. CONSTRUCTION OF ARTICLE.
- 26 (A) ENFORCEMENT.--THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE ENFORCED BY ALL
- 27 MUNICIPALITIES.
- 28 (B) ABUSIVE OR UNLAWFUL CONDUCT OF VICTIM. -- THIS ARTICLE
- 29 SHALL NOT APPLY IF THE INJURY WAS SUSTAINED BY A PERSON WHO, AT
- 30 THE TIME:

1	(1) WAS COMMITTING A WILLFUL TRESPASS OR OTHER TORT UPON
2	THE PREMISES OCCUPIED BY THE OWNER OR KEEPER OF THE DOG;
3	(2) WAS TORMENTING, ABUSING OR ASSAULTING THE DOG;
4	(3) HAS, IN THE PAST, BEEN OBSERVED OR REPORTED TO HAVE
5	TORMENTED, ABUSED OR ASSAULTED THE DOG; OR
6	(4) WAS COMMITTING OR ATTEMPTING TO COMMIT A CRIME.
7	(C) FARM DOGS NO FARMER WHO OWNS AND KEEPS A DOG ON THE
8	FARM SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THIS ARTICLE IF THE FARM IS
9	CONSPICUOUSLY POSTED ALERTING VISITORS TO THE PRESENCE OF A
10	WATCH OR GUARD DOG AT ALL POINTS OF INGRESS AND EGRESS.
11	(D) PROCEDURE IN CERTAIN CITIES IN CITIES OF THE FIRST
12	CLASS, SECOND CLASS AND SECOND CLASS A, THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE
13	SHALL APPLY:
14	(1) THE FOLLOWING INDIVIDUALS MAY MAKE A COMPLAINT
15	BEFORE A MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT JUDGE, CHARGING THE OWNER OR
16	KEEPER OF THE DOG WITH HARBORING A MUZZLED DOG:
17	(I) A PERSON WHO HAS BEEN ATTACKED WITHOUT
18	PROVOCATION BY A DOG ON THE OWNER'S OR KEEPER'S PROPERTY,
19	PUBLIC PROPERTY OR ON PRIVATE PROPERTY THAT IS NOT THE
20	OWNER'S OR KEEPER'S PREMISES;
21	(II) ANYONE ON BEHALF OF A PERSON WHO HAS BEEN
22	ATTACKED WITHOUT PROVOCATION BY A DOG ON THE OWNER'S OR
23	KEEPER'S PROPERTY, PUBLIC PROPERTY OR ON PRIVATE PROPERTY
24	THAT IS NOT THE OWNER'S OR KEEPER'S PREMISES; OR
25	(III) A POLICE OFFICER OR ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER
26	EMPLOYED BY OR UNDER CONTRACT WITH THE CITY.
27	(2) THE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT JUDGE SHALL MAKE A REPORT
28	OF THE DETERMINATION UNDER SECTION 501-B(B) TO THE POLICE OR
29	ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER EMPLOYED BY OR UNDER CONTRACT WITH THE
30	CITY AND TO THE BUREAU OF DOG LAW ENFORCEMENT.

1	(3) THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE ENFORCED BY THE LOCAL POLICE

4	(4) COPIES OF ALL MUZZLED DOG DETERMINATIONS AND REPORTS
5	ON THE STATUS OF THE MUZZLED DOG SHALL BE SENT TO THE BUREAU
6	OF DOG LAW ENFORCEMENT.
7	(5) ALL KNOWN INCIDENTS OF ATTACKED BY MUZZLED DOGS
8	SHALL BE REPORTED TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF
9	KEEPING BITE STATISTICS AND POSSIBLE RABIES EXPOSURE RECORDS.
10	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
