## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in talent recruitment, further providing for Talent Recruitment Account; establishing the Grow-Your-Own Educators Grant Program and grow-your-own educator career pathways; and imposing duties on the Department of Education.
- 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 11 hereby enacts as follows:
- 12 Section 1. Section 1505-K of the act of March 10, 1949
- 13 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, added
- 14 July 8, 2022 (P.L.620, No.55), is amended to read:
- 15 Section 1505-K. Talent Recruitment Account.
- 16 (a) Establishment. -- The Talent Recruitment Account is
- 17 established as a restricted account in the General Fund.
- 18 (b) Use of funds. -- Money in the account is appropriated to
- 19 the department on a continuing basis to provide grants in
- 20 accordance with [section 1506-K] sections 1506-K and 1504-K.1.
- 21 The appropriation shall not lapse at the end of any fiscal year.

- 1 (c) Contributions.--
- 2 (1) The State Treasurer may accept gifts, donations,
- 3 legacies or any other revenues, including allowable Federal
- 4 funds, for deposit into the account.
- 5 (2) Any interest that accrues in the account shall
- 6 remain in the account.
- 7 (d) Distribution of money. -- Money appropriated or made
- 8 available to the department for grants in accordance with
- 9 sections 1506-K and 1504-K.1 shall be distributed as follows:
- 10 (1) Not less than 50% shall be allocated to meet the
- 11 purposes of section 1506-K.
- 12 (2) Funding shall be distributed geographically
- 13 <u>throughout this Commonwealth.</u>
- 14 Section 2. The act is amended by adding an article to read:
- 15 ARTICLE XV-K.1
- 16 GROW-YOUR-OWN EDUCATORS GRANT PROGRAM
- 17 Section 1501-K.1. Scope of article.
- 18 This article relates to grow-your-own educator career
- 19 pathways and the Grow-Your-Own Educators Grant Program.
- 20 Section 1502-K.1. Definitions.
- 21 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 22 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 23 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 24 "Approved educator preparation program." A sequence of
- 25 courses and experiences offered by an institution of higher
- 26 education or alternative program provider that is reviewed and
- 27 <u>approved by the department or an education career pathways</u>
- 28 program that prepares students to transfer into an approved
- 29 <u>educator preparation program.</u>
- 30 "Career and technical student organization." An in-school

- 1 <u>organization that provides personal and leadership development</u>
- 2 related to a career and technical program area as recognized by
- 3 the United States Department of Education.
- 4 <u>"Cohort model." An educator preparation model under which a</u>
- 5 group of participants begin, proceed through and complete a
- 6 pattern of courses together, allowing the participants to work
- 7 <u>collaboratively and share their experiences.</u>
- 8 <u>"Committee." As defined in section 1502-K.</u>
- 9 "Community organization." A public or private not-for-profit
- 10 organization with a demonstrated commitment of providing
- 11 resources and services to improving the educational and social
- 12 <u>well-being of a community or a specific population within a</u>
- 13 community.
- 14 <u>"Department." The Department of Education of the</u>
- 15 Commonwealth.
- 16 <u>"Education support professional." An employee of a school</u>
- 17 entity who is not any of the following:
- 18 (1) A professional employee, as the term "professional"
- 19 employe" is defined in section 1101(1).
- 20 (2) A substitute, as the term is defined in section
- 21 1101(2).
- 22 (3) A temporary professional employee, as the term
- 23 "temporary professional employe" is defined in section
- 24 1101(3).
- 25 "Employee organization." As the term "employe organization"
- 26 is defined in section 301(3) of the act of July 23, 1970
- 27 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act.
- 28 "Evidence-based." As defined in 20 U.S.C. § 7801(21)
- 29 <u>(relating to definitions).</u>
- "Institution of higher education." Any of the following:

- 1 (1) A community college under Article XIX-A.
- 2 (2) A rural regional college under Article XIX-G.
- 3 (3) An institution which is part of the State System of
- 4 <u>Higher Education under Article XX-A.</u>
- 5 (4) A State-related institution as defined in section
- 6 <u>2001-D.</u>
- 7 (5) The Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.
- 8 <u>(6) An accredited, private or independent college or</u>
- 9 <u>university located in this Commonwealth.</u>
- 10 "Partnership." As follows:
- 11 (1) A collaboration among at least one school entity and
- 12 <u>an institution of higher education with an approved educator</u>
- 13 <u>preparation program.</u>
- 14 <u>(2) The term may include:</u>
- 15 <u>(i) Additional school entities.</u>
- 16 <u>(ii) Additional institutions of higher education.</u>
- 17 (iii) Community organizations.
- 18 (iv) Employee organizations.
- 19 "Pathway." One of the structured grow-your-own educator
- 20 career pathways established in section 1503-K.1(b).
- 21 "Program." The Grow-Your-Own Educators Grant Program
- 22 established under section 1504-K.1.
- 23 "School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, area
- 24 career and technical school, charter school, regional charter
- 25 school, cyber charter school, approved private school or
- 26 chartered school for the education of the deaf or blind.
- 27 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 28 Section 1503-K.1. Grow-your-own educator career pathways.
- 29 (a) Purpose. -- The purpose of this section is to identify and
- 30 encourage the development and implementation of evidence-based,

Τ	<u>nign-quality grow-your-own educator career pathways throughout</u>
2	this Commonwealth, which are designed to meet specific educator
3	workforce needs of the community on a continual basis.
4	(b) Establishment The following grow-your-own educator
5	<pre>career pathways are established:</pre>
6	(1) High school student-to-aspiring educator pathway,
7	which is offered by a partnership designed for secondary
8	students with an interest in pursuing education as a
9	profession. Students in the pathway under this paragraph
0	<pre>shall:</pre>
1	(i) Participate in a co-curricular program of study
.2	for education and training that is developed by the
.3	department in accordance with section 1504-K.
4	(ii) Be provided with the following:
.5	(A) Ongoing mentorship from certified educators.
- 6	(B) Support for the transition from secondary
_7	school to a postsecondary approved educator
8 .	preparation program.
9	(C) Financial assistance in the form of free or
20	reduced tuition for eligible students that enroll in
21	a postsecondary approved educator preparation
22	program.
23	(D) For students participating in a program of
24	study offered by an area career and technical school,
25	membership in a career and technical student
26	organization for the education profession.
27	(2) Aspiring-to-enacting educator pathway, in which a
28	partnership supports participants enrolled in an approved
29	educator preparation program in successfully completing the
30	program and obtaining certification. Programs in this pathway

Τ.	<u>may include teacher residency programs and teacher registered</u>
2	apprenticeship programs and shall continue providing supports
3	during an enacting educator's induction period, where
4	applicable. At a minimum, a partnership under this pathway
5	must include the following:
6	(i) Paid clinical experience of at least one year
7	for participants, under the guidance of qualified
8	cooperating and mentor teachers.
9	(ii) Financial and training supports for cooperating
10	and mentor teachers.
11	(iii) Wraparound supports to address challenges and
12	barriers for participants, which may include financial
13	assistance, coaching, mentoring and test preparation
14	<u>assistance.</u>
15	(3) Education support professional-to-educator pathway,
16	in which current school entity staff, including
17	paraprofessionals and instructional aides, participate in
18	education and training approved by the department to become
19	full-time, certified educators in their community. A
20	partnership offering the pathway under this paragraph shall:
21	(i) Provide flexibility in course offerings, which
22	may include online and hybrid options and cohort models.
23	(ii) Apply wage-earning classroom time toward field
24	experience requirements, where appropriate.
25	(iii) Identify and address barriers that
26	participants may have encountered in accessing higher
27	education, to the extent possible.
28	(iv) Ensure minimal out-of-pocket expenses for
29	participants.
30	(v) Offer comprehensive support to participants,

- 1 <u>including tutoring and advising.</u>
- 2 (4) Community member-to-education support professional
- 3 pathway, which provides technical assistance, funding and
- 4 supports to recruit and provide high-quality preparation for
- 5 <u>community members who are committed to engaging in meaningful</u>
- 6 employment in the school entity in their local community. A
- 7 partnership providing the pathway under this paragraph shall
- 8 <u>demonstrate that:</u>
- 9 <u>(i) barriers to recruitment and retention will be</u>
- identified and addressed, to the extent possible;
- 11 (ii) requisite training will be provided; and
- 12 <u>(iii) participants will earn appropriate credentials</u>
- 13 <u>upon completion of the pathway program.</u>
- 14 <u>Section 1504-K.1. Grow-Your-Own Educators Grant Program.</u>
- 15 <u>(a) Establishment.--The Grow-Your-Own Educators Grant</u>
- 16 Program is established in the department.
- 17 (b) Purpose. -- To the extent that money is appropriated for
- 18 the program, the department shall award grants on a competitive
- 19 basis to eligible partnerships for the purpose of establishing
- 20 or expanding grow-your-own educator career pathways that meet
- 21 criteria for funding.
- 22 (c) Funding. -- Grants under the program shall be funded with
- 23 money in the Talent Recruitment Account under section 1505-K and
- 24 with any other money made available for this purpose.
- 25 (d) Priority. -- The secretary shall give priority to an
- 26 application for a grant under the program to partnerships that
- 27 <u>include school entities that:</u>
- 28 (1) Have or previously had an acute poverty percentage
- 29 equal to or greater than 30%, as calculated under section
- 30 2502.53(c)(1)(ii).

1	(2) Have demonstrated shortages of educators, including
2	inequitable access to effective educators for all students as
3	required by 20 U.S.C. § 6311(g)(1)(B) (relating to State
4	plans).
5	(3) Have demonstrated cooperation with one or more
6	employee organizations in the school entity in designing the
7	proposed program, as applicable.
8	Section 1505-K.1. Duties of department.
9	The department shall have the following powers and duties in
0 ـ	<pre>implementing this article:</pre>
1	(1) Provide technical assistance to the eligible
.2	partnerships applying for grants under section 1504-K.1. The
_3	technical assistance shall include, without limitation, the
4	<pre>following:</pre>
_5	(i) Consultation with partnerships to assist in the
-6	planning, development and implementation of one or more
_7	grow-your-own educator career pathways.
8 .	(ii) Consultation with partnerships in identifying
_9	and maximizing funding from additional sources for the
20	sustainability of the pathway beyond the grant.
21	(iii) Resources on evidence-based grow-your-own
22	programming, which shall be posted on the department's
23	publicly accessible Internet website.
24	(2) Within 90 days of the effective date of this
25	paragraph and in consultation with the committee, adopt
26	guidelines for the program including, at a minimum:
27	(i) Criteria for grant eligibility and procedures
28	and criteria for awarding grants under the program,
29	including prioritization of applications under section
30	1504-K.1(d).

1	<u>(ii) Required and allowable grant uses.</u>
2	(iii) Permitted funding levels or limitations and
3	the renewability of grants.
4	(iv) The form, manner and time frame for eligible
5	partnerships to apply for a grant. Each application for a
6	<pre>grant must include:</pre>
7	(A) A statement of objectives and overview of
8	the proposed education career pathway to be offered
9	by the partnership.
10	(B) A needs assessment, including current and
11	future needs for an effective and diverse educator
12	workforce based on relevant data determined by the
13	<pre>department.</pre>
14	(C) Documentation of agreement for the
15	partnership, including an overview of the planning
16	process reflecting meaningful engagement of
17	stakeholders and commitment of an established group
18	of educators and administrators to supporting the
19	pathway and its participants.
20	(D) A description of the high-quality wraparound
21	supports to be provided to participants, as
22	applicable.
23	(E) A description of assessments to ensure that
24	participants will be prepared to meet State-required
25	competencies for educational professionals.
26	(F) A description of how the pathway will
27	integrate comprehensive and coordinated field
28	experiences which embed effective educator
29	competencies throughout the program.
30	(G) A description of how the partnership will

1	define success, monitor progress and make program
2	<pre>improvements.</pre>
3	(H) A description of community-based recruitment
4	efforts, as applicable.
5	(I) A description of how participation in the
6	program will result in an industry-recognized
7	credential, certification, postsecondary credit
8	attainment or employment eligibility.
9	(J) A proposed budget for the program,
10	<pre>including:</pre>
11	(I) The amount of the grant requested.
12	(II) Additional financial resources to be
13	used for the program.
14	(III) An outline of anticipated costs for a
15	high-quality, sustainable program, including
16	wraparound supports for participants, stipends
17	for participants and their mentors, additional
18	staffing needed for implementation and costs for
19	trainings and instructional resources.
20	(3) Carry out all other functions necessary to implement
21	this article, including:
22	(i) Begin awarding grants under the program no later
23	than December 31, 2023, and by each December 1
24	thereafter.
25	(ii) In consultation with the committee, at least
26	every three years review the guidelines and standards,
27	grant application and program and pathway requirements
28	and make revisions if necessary.
29	(iii) Post all guidelines, standards and forms for
30	implementation of this article on its publicly accessible

- 2 Section 1506-K.1. Annual reports.
- 3 (a) Submittal.--By December 31, 2024, and by each December
- 4 <u>31 thereafter, the department shall submit a report, in </u>
- 5 <u>accordance with subsection (b), to the following:</u>
- 6 (1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 7 Appropriations Committee of the Senate.
- 8 (2) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 9 <u>Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.</u>
- 10 (3) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 11 Education Committee of the Senate.
- 12 <u>(4) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the</u>
- 13 <u>Education Committee of the House of Representatives.</u>
- 14 (b) Contents. -- Each report under this section shall include:
- 15 (1) An assessment of the impact of the program.
- (2) Recommendations for improvements to the program and
- 17 grow-your-own educator career pathways.
- 18 (3) Relevant data concerning types of partnerships
- 19 created.
- 20 (4) The number and demographics of participants in each
- 21 pathway.
- 22 (5) The number and dollar amounts of grants awarded
- 23 under the program.
- 24 (6) A description of the uses of the grants awarded
- 25 under the program.
- 26 (c) Posting. -- The department shall post each report under
- 27 this section on its publicly accessible Internet website.
- 28 Section 1507-K.1. Existing collective bargaining agreements.
- Nothing in this article shall be construed to supersede or
- 30 preempt a provision of a collective bargaining agreement between

- 1 <u>a school entity and an employee organization or a right of an</u>
- 2 <u>employee organization under the provisions of the act of July</u>
- 3 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe
- 4 Relations Act.
- 5 Section 1508-K.1. Exclusions.
- 6 (a) Supplemental spending. -- Grants received under this
- 7 <u>article shall supplement and not supplant existing school entity</u>
- 8 spending on educator recruitment and retention. A school entity
- 9 may use a grant received under this article to pay costs related
- 10 to a pathway initiated by the school entity within the 12 months
- 11 prior to the effective date of this article that satisfies the
- 12 requirements of section 1503-K.1. Nothing shall preclude a
- 13 <u>school entity from making an application in a subsequent year</u>
- 14 for the same purpose and amount awarded in a prior year.
- 15 (b) Calculation of amounts paid. -- Notwithstanding any other
- 16 provision of law, a grant received by a school entity under this
- 17 article shall not be included in the school entity's budgeted
- 18 total expenditure per average daily membership used to calculate
- 19 the amount to be paid to a charter school, regional charter
- 20 school or cyber charter school under section 1725-A(a)(2) and
- 21 (3).
- 22 (c) Entitlement. -- Nothing in this article shall be construed
- 23 to create an entitlement or a right to financial assistance as a
- 24 result of a grant received under this article.
- 25 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
