## AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), entitled, as 1 amended, "An act relating to the practice of professional nursing; providing for the licensing of nurses and for the revocation and suspension of such licenses, subject to appeal, and for their reinstatement; providing for the renewal of such licenses; regulating nursing in general; 5 6 prescribing penalties and repealing certain laws," providing 7 for delegation of functions necessary for the support of nursing services. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, 13 No.69), known as The Professional Nursing Law, is amended by 14 adding a definition to read: 15 Section 2. Definitions. -- When used in this act, the 16 following words and phrases shall have the following meanings 17 unless the context provides otherwise: 18 19 (16) "Delegate" or "delegation" means the transfer of
- 20 <u>responsibility for the performance of a task or function from</u>

- 1 the professional nurse to another individual who may or may not
- 2 be a health care provider, licensed or unlicensed, while
- 3 retaining accountability for the outcome.
- 4 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 5 Section 4.2. Delegation of Functions. -- (a) A registered
- 6 <u>nurse may delegate a function if all of the following conditions</u>
- 7 are met:
- 8 (1) The delegation is consistent with the scope and
- 9 standards of acceptable nursing practice as defined by license
- 10 or certificate or otherwise authorized by law.
- 11 (2) The delegation is not prohibited by statute or
- 12 regulation, including regulations promulgated by the board.
- 13 (3) The registered nurse has knowledge that the individual
- 14 to whom the function is being delegated has the requisite
- 15 <u>education</u>, training, experience and continued competency to
- 16 <u>safely perform the delegated function</u>.
- 17 (4) The registered nurse has determined that the delegation
- 18 does not create an undue risk to the patient.
- 19 (b) A registered nurse shall be responsible for the
- 20 <u>delegated function in accordance with subsection (a). A</u>
- 21 registered nurse's responsibility for the delegated task is not
- 22 <u>limited by any provisions of this section.</u>
- 23 (c) A registered nurse may not delegate a task that:
- 24 (1) requires knowledge and skill beyond the validated
- 25 competencies of the individual to whom the function is being
- 26 <u>delegated</u>; or
- 27 (2) the registered nurse is not educated, trained and
- 28 <u>competent to perform.</u>
- 29 (d) Nothing in this section may be construed as limiting the
- 30 <u>authority of a physician to delegate as contained within the act</u>

- 1 of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), known as the "Medical
- 2 Practice Act of 1985."
- 3 (e) Within 180 days of the effective date of this section,
- 4 the board shall promulgate regulations that establish criteria
- 5 pursuant to which a registered nurse may delegate the
- 6 performance of nursing functions.
- 7 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
