AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Pennsylvania Career Readiness Council; and 2 providing for its powers and duties.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- 7 Career Readiness Council Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Charter school." A charter school, regional charter school
- 13 or cyber charter school established under Article XVII-A of the
- 14 Public School Code of 1949.
- 15 "Chief school administrator." The superintendent or chief
- 16 executive officer of a school district, director of an area
- 17 vocational-technical school, executive director of an

- 1 intermediate unit or chief executive officer of a charter
- 2 school, regional charter school or cyber charter school.
- 3 "Community college." An institution created under either of
- 4 the following:
- 5 (1) Article XIX-A of the Public School Code of 1949.
- 6 (2) The act of August 24, 1963 (P.L.1132, No.484), known
- 7 as the Community College Act of 1963.
- 8 "Council." The Pennsylvania Career Readiness Council
- 9 established under this act.
- 10 "High-priority occupation." A job category, within selected
- 11 industry clusters, that is identified by the Department of Labor
- 12 and Industry as:
- 13 (1) being in demand by employers; and
- 14 (2) likely to provide family-sustaining wages.
- "Independent institution of higher education." The term as
- 16 defined under section 2001-C of the Public School Code of 1949.
- 17 "Intermediate unit." A geographic unit as described under
- 18 Article IX-A of the Public School Code of 1949.
- 19 "Labor organization." As follows:
- 20 (1) The term as defined under section 3(f) of the act of
- 21 June 1, 1937 (P.L.1168, No.294), known as the Pennsylvania
- 22 Labor Relations Act.
- 23 (2) An "employe organization," as defined under section
- 301(3) of the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known
- as the Public Employe Relations Act.
- 26 "Local workforce investment board." The term as defined
- 27 under section 103 of the Workforce Development Act.
- 28 "Pennsylvania Workforce Investment Board." The Pennsylvania
- 29 Workforce Investment Board established under section 301 of the
- 30 Workforce Development Act.

- 1 "Public School Code of 1949." The act of March 10, 1949
- 2 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949.
- 3 "Rural public school district." A public school district
- 4 that has a population of less than 300 people per square mile.
- 5 The term also includes an intermediate unit or area vocational-
- 6 technical school if the composite data for all participating
- 7 school districts meet the criteria specified under this
- 8 definition.
- 9 "School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, area
- 10 vocational-technical school or charter school.
- "State-related institution." The Pennsylvania State
- 12 University, the University of Pittsburgh, Temple University,
- 13 Lincoln University and their branch campuses.
- "State System of Higher Education." The State System of
- 15 Higher Education established under Article XX-A of the Public
- 16 School Code of 1949.
- "Suburban public school district." A public school district
- 18 that has a population of at least 300 people per square mile and
- 19 not more than 850 people per square mile. The term also includes
- 20 an intermediate unit or area vocational-technical school if the
- 21 composite data for all participating school districts meet the
- 22 criteria specified under this definition.
- "Urban public school district." A public school district
- 24 that has a population of more than 850 people per square mile.
- 25 The term also includes an intermediate unit or area vocational-
- 26 technical school if the composite data for all participating
- 27 school districts meet the criteria specified under this
- 28 definition.
- "Workforce Development Act." The act of December 18, 2001
- 30 (P.L.949, No.114), known as the Workforce Development Act.

- 1 Section 3. Pennsylvania Career Readiness Council.
- 2 (a) Establishment. -- The Pennsylvania Career Readiness
- 3 Council is established within the Department of Community and
- 4 Economic Development.
- 5 (b) Membership.--The Pennsylvania Career Readiness Council
- 6 shall consist of the following members:
- 7 (1) One representative of directors of a local workforce
- 8 development board appointed by the Governor from a list of
- 9 three qualified director representatives recommended by the
- 10 Pennsylvania Workforce Development Board.
- 11 (2) One member of the Pennsylvania Workforce Development
- Board appointed by the Secretary of Labor and Industry.
- 13 (3) One representative of presidents of institutions of
- 14 the State System of Higher Education appointed by the
- Governor from a list of three qualified president
- 16 representatives recommended by the Chancellor of the State
- 17 System of Higher Education.
- 18 (4) One representative of presidents of community
- 19 colleges appointed by the Governor from a list of three
- 20 qualified president representatives recommended by the
- 21 Pennsylvania Commission for Community Colleges.
- 22 (5) One representative of chief school administrators
- 23 appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified
- 24 chief school administrators recommended by the Pennsylvania
- 25 Association of Intermediate Units.
- 26 (6) One member of the State Board of Education appointed
- 27 by the Secretary of Education.
- 28 (7) One representative of public school educators
- 29 appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified
- 30 educators recommended by the Pennsylvania State Education

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- 2 (8) One representative of career and technical education 3 appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified 4 professionals in career and technical education recommended 5 by the Pennsylvania Association of Career and Technical 6 Administrators.
 - (9) One representative of directors of economic development entities appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified director representatives recommended by the Pennsylvania Economic Development Association.
 - (10) One representative of presidents of local chambers of business and industry appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified presidents recommended by the Pennsylvania Chamber of Business and Industry.
 - (11) Six chief executive officers in high-growth industries that collectively represent the business diversity of this Commonwealth, accounting for size, geography and industry appointed by the following:
 - (i) Two members appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified chief executive officers recommended in a letter of interest by the staff of the council.
 - (ii) One member appointed by the President protempore of the Senate.
- 25 (iii) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of 26 the Senate.
- 27 (iv) One member appointed by the Speaker of the 28 House of Representatives.
- 29 (v) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of 30 the House of Representatives.

- 1 (12) One representative from the Pennsylvania State
- 2 Education Association appointed by the Pennsylvania State
- 3 Education Association.
- 4 (13) One representative of school administrators
- 5 appointed by the Pennsylvania School Boards Association.
- 6 (14) One representative of a labor organization
- 7 appointed by the labor organization.
- 8 (15) One member appointed by the Governor who is the
- 9 president of a State-related institution.
- 10 (16) One member appointed by the Governor who is the
- 11 president of an independent institution of higher education.
- 12 (17) The Governor, the Secretary of Community and
- 13 Economic Development, the Secretary of Education, the
- 14 Secretary of Labor and Industry, the President pro tempore of
- 15 the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of
- the House of Representatives and the Minority Leader of the
- 17 House of Representatives, who shall be ex officio members.
- 18 (c) Designees.--Governmental members may appoint a designee
- 19 to attend and vote at meetings of the council. Each governmental
- 20 member who appoints a designee shall do so by sending a letter
- 21 to the chairperson stating the name of the designee.
- 22 (d) Terms. -- The following shall apply:
- 23 (1) The initial terms of members appointed under
- 24 subsection (b) shall be staggered as follows:
- 25 (i) Seven members shall serve a term of one year.
- 26 (ii) Seven members shall serve a term of two years.
- 27 (iii) Seven members shall serve a term of three
- years.
- 29 (2) The subsequent terms of members appointed under
- 30 subsection (b) shall be three years.

- 1 (e) Vacancies.--If a vacancy on the council occurs, the
- 2 appointing authority shall appoint an individual to fill the
- 3 vacancy in accordance with the criteria under subsection (b).
- 4 (f) Executive director. -- The following shall apply:
- 5 (1) The Governor shall nominate an individual as
- 6 executive director to the council. The council shall ratify
- 7 the nomination for executive director with a vote of a simple
- 8 majority of the members of the council.
- 9 (2) The executive director may hire additional staff as
- 10 necessary and as funding allows.
- 11 (3) The executive director may solicit funding for the
- operation of the council and in order to comply with
- 13 subsection (k)(2).
- 14 (g) Council leadership. -- The following shall apply:
- 15 (1) The Governor shall serve as the chairperson of the
- 16 council.
- 17 (2) The Governor shall select an appointed business
- 18 chief executive to serve as vice-chairperson of the council
- in accordance with subsection (b).
- 20 (h) Meetings. -- The following shall apply:
- 21 (1) The council shall meet at the call of the
- chairperson, but no less than four times a year.
- 23 (2) The chairperson, in consultation with the vice-
- chairperson, shall establish the agenda for each meeting of
- 25 the council.
- 26 (i) Quorum and official action. -- The following shall apply:
- 27 (1) A majority of voting members of the council shall
- constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting business.
- 29 (2) The affirmative votes of a majority of voting
- 30 members of the council are necessary for the council to take

- 1 official action.
- 2 (j) Reimbursement. -- The members of the council may not
- 3 receive a salary or per diem allowance for serving as members of
- 4 the council, but shall be reimbursed for the actual and
- 5 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of the members'
- 6 duties.
- 7 (k) Funding.--
- 8 (1) Subject to paragraph (2), the council may receive
- 9 appropriations directly or indirectly from the General
- 10 Assembly, grants from the Federal Government, grants from the
- 11 Commonwealth, money from private entities or any combination
- 12 thereof.
- 13 (2) The council shall, not later than the third fiscal
- 14 year that commences after the effective date of this section,
- operate only with funding from sources enumerated in
- paragraph (1), excluding appropriations from the General Fund
- 17 to the council or the Department of Community and Economic
- 18 Development.
- 19 (1) Conflict of interest.——A member of the council may not
- 20 vote on a matter under consideration by the council:
- 21 (1) regarding the provision of services by the member or
- by an entity that the member represents; or
- 23 (2) which would provide direct financial benefit to the
- 24 member or the immediate family of the member.
- 25 Section 4. Duties of council.
- 26 (a) Duties.--The council shall:
- 27 (1) Within 180 days of the effective date of this
- section, develop a vision and mission statement that makes
- 29 clear the council's purpose as well as the respective roles
- and responsibilities of council members.

1 (2) Within one year of the effective date of this 2 section, develop a plan in consultation with the Pennsylvania 3 Workforce Investment Board to improve this Commonwealth's career readiness preparation system. The plan developed under 4 5 this paragraph shall include, but not be limited to: 6 (i)Proposed changes to: improve the transition from K-12 education 7 8 and postsecondary education to the workforce; and 9 ensure that programs are aligned with 10 current or anticipated business and industry needs. 11 Proposed changes, including recommended 12 legislation and rules, to increase coordination, data 13 sharing and communication among State, local and private 14 agencies, groups and associations that are involved in 15 education, job skills development and career training. 16 (iii) Proposed changes to make this Commonwealth a 17 leader in employment opportunities related to the fields 18 of science, technology, engineering and mathematics. 19 Identify appropriate information and request 20 appropriate data disaggregated by subgroups from council 21 members in order to make recommendations for system 22 improvement and set goals regarding, at a minimum, the 23 following areas: 24 Availability of and access to high-quality 25 career pathways in high-demand industry occupations 26 spanning secondary and postsecondary education. 27 (ii) Availability of and access to high-quality 28 work-based learning and preapprenticeship/apprenticeship 29 opportunities.

- credit and industry-recognized credentials in high-demand occupations, especially those related to the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics.
 - (4) Develop a sustainable process for identifying and addressing equity gaps in the career preparation delivery system.
 - (5) Develop a sustainable process for identifying opportunities to align this Commonwealth's education and training pipeline in response to labor market needs, including, but not limited to:
 - (i) Cataloging all funding sources, including Federal, State and private, that can be utilized for education, career training and workforce preparation.
 - (ii) Reviewing funding streams for overlaps and gaps with a special focus on identifying areas with inequitable student access.
 - (iii) Developing and implementing plans to improve alignment and more effectively prepare all secondary students for postsecondary success in high-demand occupations.
 - (iv) Identifying strategies for leveraging and aligning Federal, State and private funding sources.
 - (6) Create a public repository that includes, but is not limited to, national and state model partnerships between industry and education, career pathway programs in this Commonwealth and other national and state best practices in career readiness preparation.
 - (7) Coordinate Statewide and regional conventions to:
 - (i) highlight national and state best practices;
- 30 (ii) connect the work within this Commonwealth; and

- 1 (iii) benchmark the work toward national standards.
- 2 (8) Develop and maintain a marketing, communications and
- 3 stakeholder engagement strategy, with a website and other
- 4 public materials, to be maintained by the executive director
- 5 and council staff.

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- (9) Obtain input from the following:
- 7 (i) Employers and employer organizations located in this Commonwealth.
- 9 (ii) State System of Higher Education institutions,
 10 State-related institutions, community colleges and
 11 independent institutions of higher education.
- 12 (iii) Regional and local economic development
 13 organizations.
 - (iv) Labor organizations located in this Commonwealth.
- 16 (v) Individuals with expertise in career readiness
 17 preparation activities.
 - (vi) Local workforce investment boards.
- 19 (vii) School entities.
- 20 (viii) Military and veterans organizations.
- 21 (ix) Organizations representing women, African
- 22 Americans, Latinos and other significant minority
- 24 particular concern to these populations.
- 25 (x) Any other individual or organization that a
- 26 majority of the voting members of the council determines

populations and having an interest in issues of

- 27 has information that is important for the council to
- consider.
- 29 (b) Report.--The council shall submit an annual report to
- 30 the General Assembly, the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief

- 1 Clerk of the House of Representatives that details the progress
- 2 made by the council according to the plan referenced under
- 3 subsection (a)(2), with accompanying recommendations for further
- 4 action to be taken.
- 5 Section 5. Notice in Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- In the event that the council lacks sufficient funding to
- 7 comply with section 3(k)(2), the executive director shall
- 8 transmit notice thereof to the Legislative Reference Bureau for
- 9 publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 10 Section 6. Expiration.
- 11 This act shall expire upon publication of the notice in
- 12 section 5.
- 13 Section 7. Effective date.
- 14 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
