AN ACT

Amending the act of May 15, 1945 (P.L.547, No.217), entitled "An 1 act relating to the conservation of soil, water and related 2 natural resources and land use practices contributing to soil 3 wastage and soil erosion; providing for the organization of the various counties into conservation districts; the 5 appointment of their officers and employes; and prescribing 6 their powers and duties; creating the State Conservation 7 Commission in the Department of Environmental Resources and 8 fixing its powers and duties relative to the administration 9 10 of this act; providing financial and legal assistance to such conservation districts and the commission; and authorizing 11 county governing bodies to make appropriations thereto; 12 providing for disposition and operation of existing 13 districts; and repealing existing laws, "further providing 14 15 for Commonwealth agencies to cooperate. 16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 17 hereby enacts as follows: 18 Section 1. Section 11(2) of the act of May 15, 1945 19 (P.L.547, No.217), known as the Conservation District Law, is 2.0 amended to read: 21 Section 11. Commonwealth Agencies to Cooperate. --* * * 22 In accordance with regulations adopted by the 23 Environmental Quality Board, the department may, by agreement, 24 delegate to a district one or more of its regulatory and

- 2 June 22, 1937 (P.L.1987, No.394), known as "The Clean Streams
- 3 Law," and the rules and regulations adopted thereunder; the act
- 4 of May 31, 1945 (P.L.1198, No.418), known as the "Surface Mining
- 5 Conservation and Reclamation Act;" the act of October 4, 1978
- 6 (P.L.851, No.166), known as the "Flood Plain Management Act,"
- 7 and the rules and regulations adopted thereunder; the act of
- 8 November 26, 1978 (P.L.1375, No.325), known as the "Dam Safety
- 9 and Encroachments Act," and the rules and regulations adopted
- 10 thereunder; and the act of July 7, 1980 (P.L.380, No.97), known
- 11 as the "Solid Waste Management Act," and the rules and
- 12 regulations adopted thereunder.
- 13 (a.1) Notwithstanding subparagraph (a), beginning on the
- 14 effective date of this subparagraph, each of the regulatory and
- 15 enforcement functions of the department under the following laws
- 16 that are conducted by the department on normal agricultural
- 17 operations, as defined in the act of June 10, 1982 (P.L.454,
- 18 No.133), referred to as the Right-to-Farm Law, shall by
- 19 agreement be delegated to the commission:
- 20 (i) "The Clean Streams Law" and the rules and regulations
- 21 adopted thereunder.
- 22 <u>(ii) The "Flood Plain Management Act" and the rules and</u>
- 23 regulations adopted thereunder.
- 24 (iii) The "Dam Safety and Encroachments Act" and the rules
- 25 and regulations adopted thereunder.
- 26 (iv) The "Solid Waste Management Act" and the rules and
- 27 <u>regulations adopted thereunder.</u>

- 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
