AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- 5 laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, further
- 6 providing for Keystone Exams.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 121 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
- 10 No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, added June 30,
- 11 2012 (P.L.684, No.82), is amended to read:
- 12 Section 121. Keystone Exams. -- (a) Subject to annual
- 13 appropriation, not later than the 2020-2021 school year, the
- 14 Department of Education shall develop and implement Keystone
- 15 Exams in the following subjects: algebra I, literature, biology,
- 16 English composition, algebra II, geometry, United States
- 17 history, chemistry, civics and government and world history. The
- 18 State Board of Education shall promulgate regulations, subject

- 1 to the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the
- 2 "Regulatory Review Act," necessary to implement this section.
- 3 (b) THE FOLLOWING SHALL APPLY:

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- 4 (1) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code § <--
- 5 <u>4.24 (relating to high school graduation requirements)</u>, 4.51
- 6 <u>(relating to State assessment system) or 4.51c (relating to</u>
- 7 project-based assessment) or any statute or regulation to the
- 8 contrary, the use of the Keystone Exam as a graduation
- 9 requirement or as a benchmark for the need for participation in
- 10 a project-based assessment shall be delayed until the 2018-2019
- 11 <u>school year.</u>
- 12 (2) THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL INVESTIGATE AND
- <--
- 13 <u>DEVELOP ALTERNATIVES IN ADDITION TO THE USE OF THE KEYSTONE</u>
- 14 EXAMS AS A REQUIREMENT FOR GRADUATION AND SHALL, WITHIN SIX (6)
- 15 MONTHS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS PARAGRAPH, ISSUE A REPORT
- 16 OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION'S FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS,
- 17 INCLUDING PROPOSED LEGISLATION, TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY
- 18 CHAIRMAN OF THE EDUCATION COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE
- 19 CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE EDUCATION COMMITTEE OF THE
- 20 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. THE REPORT SHALL, AT A MINIMUM,
- 21 CONTAIN A DETAILED PLAN AND TIMELINE WITHIN WHICH THE DEPARTMENT
- 22 OF EDUCATION SHALL ACCOMPLISH ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 23 (I) IMPLEMENT ALTERNATIVE METHODS FOR STUDENTS TO
- 24 DEMONSTRATE PROFICIENCY FOR GRADUATION IN ADDITION TO THE
- 25 <u>KEYSTONE EXAMS, PROJECT-BASED ASSESSMENT AND OTHER ALTERNATIVE</u>
- 26 ASSESSMENTS PROVIDED FOR IN 22 PA. CODE § 4.24.
- 27 (II) IMPROVE AND EXPEDITE THE EVALUATION OF PROJECT-BASED
- 28 <u>ASSESSMENTS.</u>
- 29 (III) ENSURE THAT NO STUDENT IS PROHIBITED FROM
- 30 PARTICIPATION IN VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL EDUCATION OR ELECTIVE

- 1 COURSES OR PROGRAMS AS A RESULT OF SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTION
- 2 REQUIRED IN 22 PA. CODE §§ 4.24(K) AND 4.51B(F) (RELATING TO
- 3 <u>KEYSTONE EXAMS).</u>
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
