5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Section 2107 of Title 74 of the Pennsylvania
8	Consolidated Statutes is repealed:
9	[§ 2107. Balanced Multimodal Transportation Policy Commission.
10	(a) CommissionThere is established a Balanced Multimodal
11	Transportation Policy Commission to study and make
12	recommendations on developing and maintaining a balanced
13	multimodal transportation policy for this Commonwealth.
14	(b) MembersThe commission shall consist of the following
15	members:
16	(1) The Secretary of Transportation.
17	(2) The Secretary of Community and Economic Development.
18	(3) The Secretary of Environmental Protection.
19	(4) One appointment from each of the following:

(i) the President pro tempore of the Senate;
2 (ii) the Minority Leader of the Senate;
3 (iii) the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
4 and
5 (iv) the Minority Leader of the House of
6 Representatives.
7 (5) Two appointments from the Governor, at least one of
8 which must have expertise in regional planning.
9 (6) Six additional members may be appointed by the
10 commission members under paragraphs (1), (2), (3), (4) and
11 (5).
12 (c) ChairpersonThe members of the commission under
13 paragraphs (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5) shall elect a chairperson
14 from among the members.
15 (d) TermsMembers of the commission may serve on the
16 commission until replaced by an appointing authority under
17 subsection (b).
18 (e) StudyThe commission shall study facets on
19 implementing balanced multimodal transportation policies for
20 metropolitan areas in this Commonwealth, which shall include at
21 least the cities of the first class and second class, but may
22 include other regions as well.
23 (f) StaffUpon recommendation of the commission, the
24 Secretary of Transportation may hire independent consultants to
25 aid the work of the commission. The commission shall be staffed
26 by employees of the Department of Transportation. Ordinary
27 expenses shall be paid to members of the commission.
28 (g) ReportNo later than two years after the effective
29 date of this section, the commission shall issue its initial
30 report to the Governor and members of the General Assembly and a
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- 1 report every four years thereafter.]
- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
