## AN ACT

Designating a portion of State Route 2005 in Saxonburg Borough, Butler County, as the Chief Gregory B. Adams Way; designating 2 a bridge on that portion of Pennsylvania Route 271 over US 3 Route 22, Jackson Township, Cambria County, as the Trooper Gary Fisher Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion of Pennsylvania Route 53 over US Route 22, Cresson Township, Cambria County, as the Corporal Robert J. Sherwood, Jr., Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on Segment 80 of 8 State Route 2015, along Overbridge Street and over Railroad Street, Lilly Borough, Cambria County, as the Paul E. Sweeney 10 Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion of 11 Avenue A over the Allegheny River, Coudersport Borough, 12 Potter County, as the Commander Philip F. "Jet" Palmatier, 13 Jr., Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion of 14 Sunnyside Road over the Oswayo Creek, Shinglehouse Borough, 15 Potter County, as the PVT Malon Stanley Memorial Bridge; 16 designating a portion of State Route 1001 in Greene Township, 17 Franklin County, as the Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman, 18 19 Jr., Memorial Highway; designating a bridge on that portion 20 of State Route 533 over Muddy Run, Southampton Township, Franklin County, as the Private First Class Dana Edward Diehl 21 22 Memorial Bridge; and designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 1004 over the Conococheague Creek, Greene 23 Township, Franklin County, as the Private Charles W. "Bill" 25 Roher Memorial Bridge.

- 26 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 27 hereby enacts as follows:
- 28 Section 1. Chief Gregory B. Adams Way.
- 29 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as

- 1 follows:
- 2 (1) Gregory B. Adams was born in Natrona Heights, Butler
- 3 County.
- 4 (2) Gregory B. Adams, a husband and father of two, was a
- 5 graduate of the University of Wisconsin and a veteran of the
- 6 United States Marine Corps.
- 7 (3) In 1973, Gregory B. Adams joined the Saxonburg
- 8 Police Department, and several years later he was promoted to
- 9 Chief of Police.
- 10 (4) On December 4, 1980, Chief Gregory B. Adams gave his
- life in the line of duty, ending the criminal career of his
- murderer and preventing a crime from occurring in Saxonburg
- Borough.
- 14 (b) Designation. -- The section of State Route 2005, also
- 15 known as Butler Street, in Saxonburg Borough, Butler County,
- 16 from a point identified as SR2005/60 northward to the
- 17 intersection of Water Street, identified as SR2010/160, is
- 18 designated the Chief Gregory B. Adams Way.
- 19 (c) Signs. -- The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 20 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
- 21 traffic in both directions on the highway.
- 22 Section 2. Trooper Gary Fisher Memorial Bridge.
- 23 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 24 follows:
- 25 (1) Gary W. Fisher was born on April 2, 1958, to William
- 26 and Patricia Fisher in Johnstown.
- 27 (2) He enlisted in the Pennsylvania State Police on
- December 8, 1980 at 22 years of age.
- 29 (3) Following graduation from the State Police Academy,
- 30 he was assigned to Troop B in Washington County.

- 1 (4) In May 1983, he transferred to the Region V Strike
- 2 Force.
- 3 (5) On February 3, 1985, at 26 years of age, Trooper
- 4 Fisher was shot and killed in the line of duty while
- 5 attempting to make an arrest during a drug exchange at the
- 6 Crossroads Plaza, East Huntingdon Township, Westmoreland
- 7 County.
- 8 (b) Designation. -- The bridge located on that portion of
- 9 Pennsylvania Route 271 over US Route 22, Jackson Township,
- 10 Cambria County, is designated the Trooper Gary Fisher Memorial
- 11 Bridge.
- 12 (c) Signs.—The department shall erect and maintain
- 13 appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to traffic
- 14 in both directions on the bridge.
- 15 Section 3. Corporal Robert J. Sherwood, Jr., Memorial Bridge.
- 16 (a) Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 17 follows:
- 18 (1) Corporal Robert J. Sherwood, Jr., was born in the
- 19 City of Altoona, Blair County, on September 5, 1947, and
- 20 enlisted in the United States Marine Corps during the Vietnam
- 21 War.
- 22 (2) On April 3, 1967, Corporal Sherwood made the
- 23 ultimate sacrifice for his country. While on patrol, his unit
- 24 came under enemy fire and he was mortally wounded helping
- 25 load injured Marines into a medical helicopter.
- 26 (3) For his service to the United States Marine Corps,
- 27 Corporal Sherwood received the following medals and ribbons:
- 28 Paratrooper Wings, Purple Heart Medal, National Defense
- 29 Medal, Vietnam Service Medal and Sharpshooter badge.
- 30 (b) Designation. -- The bridge located on Pennsylvania Route

- 1 53 in Cresson Township, Cambria County, over US Route 22 is
- 2 designated the Corporal Robert J. Sherwood, Jr., Memorial
- 3 Bridge.
- 4 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and

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- 5 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 6 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 7 Section 4. Paul E. Sweeney Memorial Bridge.
- 8 (a) Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 9 follows:
- 10 (1) A native of Lilly, Pennsylvania, 1st Sergeant Paul
- 11 E. Sweeney served in the United States Army during World War
- 12 II as a combat engineer trained in mine demolition and
- setting booby traps with the 90th Infantry Division.
- 14 (2) On June 17, 1944, his ship, the USS Susan B.
- Anthony, hit a mine, forcing the troops and crew to abandon
- 16 ship.
- 17 (3) On July 4, 1944, Sergeant Sweeney suffered injuries
- when he was targeted by a German sniper with a percussion
- 19 grenade.
- 20 (4) Sergeant Sweeney earned the Silver Star due to his
- 21 actions in the vicinity of Kerling, France, on November 12,
- 22 1944, when he risked his life to lead a tank unit through
- enemy fire to reinforce a patrol taking cover from heavy
- 24 machine guns, strategically deployed the tank unit to
- eliminate the machine guns and advanced through intense
- 26 mortar and small arms fire to attack the enemy and capture 10
- 27 prisoners.
- 28 (5) In addition to the Silver Star, Sergeant Sweeney's
- awards include the Purple Heart and the British Distinguished
- 30 Service Medal.

- 1 (6) On August 9, 2016, Sergeant Sweeney passed away at
- 2 the age of 96.
- 3 (b) Designation. -- The bridge located on Segment 80 of State
- 4 Route 2015, along Overbridge Street and over Railroad Street,
- 5 Lilly Borough, Cambria County, is designated the Paul E. Sweeney
- 6 Memorial Bridge.
- 7 (c) Signs. -- The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 8 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 9 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 10 Section 5. Commander Philip F. "Jet" Palmatier, Jr., Memorial
- 11 Bridge.
- 12 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 13 follows:
- 14 (1) Commander Philip F. "Jet" Palmatier, Jr., was born
- on November 4, 1950, in Coudersport, graduated with honors
- from the local high school and was appointed to the United
- 17 States Naval Academy.
- 18 (2) On December 10, 1990, Commander Palmatier, a career
- Navy officer, was flying a training mission over the Gulf of
- 20 Mexico when his TA-4 Skyhawk collided with another jet,
- 21 killing Commander Palmatier at 40 years of age.
- 22 (b) Designation. -- The bridge located on Avenue A, bridge ID
- 23 52400200120000, over the Allegheny River in Coudersport Borough,
- 24 Potter County, is designated the Commander Philip F. "Jet"
- 25 Palmatier, Jr., Memorial Bridge.
- 26 (c) Signs. -- The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 27 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 28 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 29 Section 6. PVT Malon Stanley Memorial Bridge.
- 30 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as

- 1 follows:
- 2 (1) PVT Malon Stanley, a native of Potter County, was
- 3 drafted into the United States Army at the start of World War
- 4 II and served in the 1st Cavalry Division.
- 5 (2) PVT Malon Stanley was part of the forces that
- 6 stormed Leyte Island under the command of General MacArthur.
- 7 PVT Malon Stanley was killed while providing cover for his
- 8 fellow troops who were ordered to retreat.
- 9 (3) PVT Malon Stanley was posthumously awarded the
- 10 Purple Heart for his service.
- 11 (b) Designation. -- The bridge #4017-0124-0220 located on
- 12 Sunnyside Road over the Oswayo Creek, Shinglehouse Borough,
- 13 Potter County, is designated the PVT Malon Stanley Memorial
- 14 Bridge.
- 15 (c) Signs. -- The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 16 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 17 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 18 Section 7. Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman, Jr., Memorial
- 19 Highway.
- 20 (a) Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 21 follows:
- 22 (1) Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman, Jr., of
- 23 Fayetteville, died while supporting combat operations in
- Helmand Province, Afghanistan, on February 1, 2010, paying
- 25 the supreme sacrifice for his nation in Operation Enduring
- 26 Freedom.
- 27 (2) A 2008 graduate of Chambersburg Area High School,
- Lance Corporal Freeman had served in the Marine Corps since
- 29 August 2008.
- 30 (3) Lance Corporal Freeman, a machine gunner assigned to

- 2nd Battalion, 2nd Marine Division, II Marine Expeditionary
- 2 Force in Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, had been on his first
- deployment in Afghanistan since October 2009.
- 4 (4) Lance Corporal Freeman was awarded the Purple Heart,
- 5 Combat Action Ribbon and the Afghanistan Campaign Medal.
- 6 (b) Designation. -- The section of State Route 1001 from
- 7 Memorial Road to Mt. Pleasant Road in Greene Township, Franklin
- 8 County, is designated the Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman,
- 9 Jr., Memorial Highway.
- 10 (c) Signs. -- The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 11 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
- 12 traffic in both directions on the highway.
- 13 Section 8. Private First Class Dana Edward Diehl Memorial
- 14 Bridge.
- 15 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 16 follows:
- 17 (1) Private First Class Dana Edward Diehl, a native of
- 18 Shippensburg, lived most of his life a few miles from the
- 19 bridge over Muddy Run. He crossed over the bridge on Sunday
- 20 mornings traveling to church, spent many hours fishing with
- 21 his father along Muddy Run and cooled off in the stream with
- 22 his family during hot summer days.
- 23 (2) Private First Class Diehl graduated from
- 24 Shippensburg Area Senior High School in 1967. During high
- school, he was a member of the wrestling team and active in
- Boy Scout Troop No. 251.
- 27 (3) Private First Class Diehl honorably served his
- country as a medical specialist with the 25th Infantry
- 29 Division, 3rd Squadron, 4th Cavalry, Headquarters Troop
- 30 HEADQUARTERS TROOP, 3RD SQUADRON, 4TH CAVALRY, 25TH INFANTRY <

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- 1 DIVISION.
- 2 (4) On December 10, 1968, in Hau Nghia Province, South
- 3 Vietnam, Private First Class Diehl was killed when the
- 4 vehicle in which he was riding was struck by an explosive
- 5 device.
- 6 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on State Route 533 over
- 7 Muddy Run in Southampton Township, Franklin County, is
- 8 designated the Private First Class Dana Edward Diehl Memorial
- 9 Bridge.
- 10 (c) Signs. -- The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 11 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 12 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 13 Section 9. Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher Memorial Bridge.
- 14 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 15 follows:
- 16 (1) Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher, a native of
- 17 Chambersburg, served in the United States Army from April 19,
- 18 1943, to March 28, 1945.
- 19 (2) Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher was a highly
- decorated veteran of World War II, having earned the Purple
- 21 Heart, Bronze Star, Combat Infantry Badge, World War II
- 22 Victory Medal, American Campaign Medal, European Theater of
- War Ribbon with one star, Good Conduct Medal, Marksman Badge
- 24 with rifle bar and Glider Badge.
- 25 (b) Designation. -- The bridge on State Route 1004 over the
- 26 Conococheague Creek in Greene Township, Franklin County, is
- 27 designated the Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher Memorial Bridge.
- 28 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 29 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 30 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

- 1 Section 10. Effective date.
- 2 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
