20	(1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3), a
21	person may not intentionally use consumer fireworks between
22	the hours of 11 n m and 10 a m

- 2 <u>consumer fireworks until 1 a.m the following day.</u>
- 3 (3) If July 4 falls on a Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday,
- 4 <u>a person may use consumer fireworks until 1 a.m. on the</u>
- 5 <u>immediately preceding and following Friday and Saturday.</u>
- 6 Section 2. Section 2414(1) of the act is amended to read:

- 8 The following shall apply:
- 9 (1) A person using consumer fireworks in violation of

- upon conviction, shall be punished [by a fine of not more
- than \$100.] as follows:
- (i) For a first offense, by a fine of not more than

- (ii) For a second offense, by a fine of not more
