AN ACT

Amending the act of October 20, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.96, 1 No.6), entitled "An act relating to mental health and 2 intellectual disability; authorizing county programs and amending, revising and changing the laws relating thereto and making an appropriation," in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; and, in responsibilities of the 6 State, providing for State center closure moratorium. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The definitions of "department" and "secretary" in section 102 of the act of October 20, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., 11 12 P.L.96, No.6), known as the Mental Health and Intellectual Disability Act of 1966, are amended and the section is amended 13 by adding a definition to read: 14 15 Section 102. Definitions .-- As used in this act: * * * 16 "Department" means the Department of [Public Welfare] Human 17 18 Services.

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- 1 "Secretary" means the Secretary of [Public Welfare] <u>Human</u>
- 2 Services.
- 3 * * *
- 4 <u>"State center" means a State operated facility, licensed by</u>
- 5 the department, to provide a level of care specially designed to
- 6 meet the needs of persons who have an intellectual disability or
- 7 persons with related conditions who require specialized health
- 8 and rehabilitative services.
- 9 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 10 <u>Section 202.1. State Center Closure Moratorium.--(a) No</u>
- 11 State center shall close until all Medicaid waiver-eligible
- 12 <u>individuals</u> in this Commonwealth are authorized to begin
- 13 receiving home and community-based services furnished under a
- 14 waiver granted pursuant to section 1915(c)(1) of the Social
- 15 <u>Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1396n(c)(1)).</u>
- 16 (b) When all Medicaid waiver-eligible individuals have
- 17 received authorization under subsection (a), the department
- 18 shall transmit notice of that fact to the Legislative Reference
- 19 Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Upon
- 20 publication of the notice, the Task Force on the Closure of
- 21 State Centers is established within the department. Within sixty
- 22 days of publication of the notice, the secretary shall convene
- 23 an initial meeting of the task force. The task force shall
- 24 perform a comprehensive evaluation of the State centers and
- 25 provide recommendations to the department prior to the closure
- 26 of one or more State centers.
- 27 <u>(c) The task force shall be comprised of the following</u>
- 28 <u>members:</u>
- 29 (1) The secretary or a designee.
- 30 (2) One representative from each State center, which may

- 1 <u>include</u>, but is not limited to, direct care providers or
- 2 administrative staff members, to be appointed by each center
- 3 director.
- 4 (3) One representative from the Governor's office.
- 5 (4) The chair and the minority chair of the Health and Human
- 6 <u>Services Committee of the Senate or their designees.</u>
- 7 (5) The chair and the minority chair of the Human Services <--
- 8 <u>HEALTH Committee of the House of Representatives or their</u>
- 9 <u>designees</u>.
- 10 (6) Two family members of residents of State centers, to be
- 11 appointed by the secretary.
- 12 (7) One representative of a nonprofit organization which
- 13 serves as an advocate for those with intellectual disabilities,
- 14 to be appointed by the secretary.
- 15 (8) One physician, psychiatrist or psychologist with
- 16 <u>experience providing services to individuals with intellectual</u>
- 17 disabilities to be appointed by the secretary in consultation
- 18 with the representatives appointed under paragraph (2).
- 19 <u>(d) The task force shall meet biweekly to evaluate the</u>
- 20 impact of a closure in all of the following areas:
- 21 (1) Residents of the State center and their families.
- 22 (2) Employes, both union and nonunion.
- 23 (3) The local economy in which the State center is located.
- 24 (4) Readiness of provider agencies in each region to expand
- 25 the community-based residential infrastructure to support
- 26 residents leaving State centers.
- 27 <u>(e) If a State center is deemed eligible for closure by way</u>
- 28 of a majority vote taken by the task force, the department shall
- 29 prepare a plan for the closure of the State center and the
- 30 transition of individuals with intellectual disabilities

- 1 receiving care in the State center to a home or community-based
- 2 <u>support system. The plan shall include all of the following:</u>
- 3 (1) An assessment of the State center, including:
- 4 (i) A certified independent appraisal of the State center
- 5 property.
- 6 (ii) A report of the State employes employed at the State
- 7 center, both full time and part time, including the total number
- 8 of employes, the cost of the total wages and total benefits paid
- 9 to the employes and an organizational flow chart of employes
- 10 working at the State center.
- 11 (iii) A detailed report of the services provided at the
- 12 State center by contracted third-party vendors.
- 13 <u>(iv) An inventory of assets located at and improvements on</u>
- 14 <u>the State center.</u>
- 15 (v) A report of all electric, utility, water, landscaping,
- 16 <u>snow removal and maintenance costs of the State center.</u>
- 17 (vi) Geospatial images of the State center.
- 18 (vii) A detailed description of the existence, ownership
- 19 rights and appraised value of any mineral rights on the State
- 20 center property.
- 21 (viii) A historical report of the institutional property,
- 22 including the date it was acquired or constructed, the dates of
- 23 any improvements on the property, any changes in property
- 24 records, such as subdivision of the property, historical
- 25 employment or complement levels and other historical data.
- 26 (2) The timeline, specific to each State center, for the
- 27 <u>transition to a home and community-based support system for all</u>
- 28 of the individuals with intellectual disabilities living at the
- 29 State center. Information required under this clause shall
- 30 specify the critical milestones in the closure process for the

- 1 State center and the department's planned course of action to
- 2 effectuate the closure of the State center, including available
- 3 and necessary resources.
- 4 (3) The home and community-based support providers available
- 5 in the immediate geographic area surrounding the State center.
- 6 (4) The process the department will utilize at each State
- 7 center to transition individuals with intellectual disabilities
- 8 <u>supported at each State center to a home and community-based</u>
- 9 <u>support system as provided under this section.</u>
- 10 (5) The process the department will utilize at the State
- 11 <u>center to close buildings and reassign staff when individuals</u>
- 12 with intellectual disabilities are transitioning from State
- 13 <u>centers to a home and community-based support system.</u>
- 14 (6) Any other information deemed appropriate by the
- 15 <u>department as part of the plan.</u>
- 16 <u>(f) A State center subject to closure must continue to</u>
- 17 operate with the level of staff necessary until all residents
- 18 have been transitioned into home or community-based services.
- 19 (g) As used in this section, the term "task force" means the
- 20 Task Force on the Closure of State Centers established in
- 21 accordance with subsection (b).
- 22 Section 3. The addition of section 202.1 of the act shall
- 23 apply to closures made after October 1, 2019.
- 24 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
