AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 40 (Insurance) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- Statutes, in general provisions, providing for health
- insurance coverage not required.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 40 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 102. Health insurance coverage not required.
- 9 <u>(a) General.--No resident of this Commonwealth, regardless</u>
- 10 of whether the resident has or is eligible for health insurance
- 11 coverage under any policy or program provided by or through the
- 12 resident's employer, or a plan sponsored by the Federal
- 13 Government or the Commonwealth, shall be required to obtain or
- 14 maintain a policy of individual insurance coverage except as
- 15 required by a court or the Department of Human Services where an
- 16 <u>individual is named a party in a judicial or administrative</u>
- 17 proceeding. No provision of law shall render a resident of this
- 18 Commonwealth liable for a penalty, assessment, fee or fine as a

- 1 result of the resident's failure to procure or obtain health
- 2 insurance coverage.
- 3 (b) Applicability. -- This section shall not apply to:
- 4 (1) Individuals voluntarily applying for coverage under
- 5 <u>a State-administered program under Title XIX of the Social</u>
- 6 <u>Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. §§ 1396-1396v) or XXI</u>
- of the Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. §§
- 1397aa-1397mm).
- 9 (2) Students being required by an institution of higher
- 10 education to obtain and maintain health insurance as a
- 11 <u>condition of enrollment.</u>
- 12 (c) Rights. -- Nothing in this section shall impair the rights
- 13 of persons to privately contract for health insurance for family
- 14 <u>members or former family members.</u>
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
