AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 7 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 12 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 17 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," in powers and duties of the Department of Drug 21 and Alcohol Programs, providing for survey of drug and 22 alcohol treatment facilities and recovery houses. 23 24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 25 hereby enacts as follows: 26 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a 27
- 28 section to read:

- 1 <u>Section 2303-A. Survey of drug and alcohol treatment facilities</u>
- and recovery houses.
- 3 (a) Annual survey. -- The Department of Drug and Alcohol
- 4 Programs shall submit an annual survey to each drug and alcohol
- 5 treatment facility licensed or certified under 28 Pa. Code Pt. V
- 6 (relating to Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs) and each
- 7 <u>licensed or certified drug and alcohol recovery house under</u>
- 8 section 2312-A within this Commonwealth to allow individuals
- 9 <u>seeking drug and alcohol treatment or recovery services to</u>
- 10 evaluate drug and alcohol treatment programs, including any
- 11 <u>deviations from evidence-based drug and alcohol treatment and</u>
- 12 recovery practices. The Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs
- 13 shall post the responses to the survey on its publicly
- 14 <u>accessible Internet website. If a drug and alcohol treatment</u>
- 15 <u>facility or drug and alcohol recovery house fails to respond to</u>
- 16 the survey, the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs shall
- 17 post that the drug and alcohol treatment facility or drug and
- 18 alcohol recovery house failed to respond to the survey on its
- 19 publicly accessible Internet website.
- 20 (b) Contents. -- The annual survey under subsection (a) shall
- 21 be in a form substantially similar to the following:
- (1) What is the name and address of your drug and
- 23 alcohol treatment facility or drug and alcohol recovery
- 24 house? If you have multiple locations, provide information
- 25 for each location.
- 26 (2) Which of the following do you operate?
- (i) <u>Inpatient treatment.</u>
- 28 (ii) Inpatient/outpatient treatment.
- 29 <u>(iii) Drug and alcohol recovery house.</u>
- (iv) Other.

1	(3) What is the size of your drug and alcohol treatment
2	facility or drug and alcohol recovery house based on the
3	following?
4	(i) Number of beds.
5	(ii) Maximum number of inpatients or residents.
6	(iii) Maximum number of outpatients.
7	(4) Do you have onsite medical facilities? If so,
8	describe the onsite medical facilities.
9	(5) How long has your drug and alcohol treatment
10	facility or drug and alcohol recovery house been in
11	operation?
12	(6) Provide a description of the staff as follows:
13	(i) Total number of full-time staff.
14	(ii) Total number of part-time staff.
15	(iii) The number of staff with special licenses or
16	specialties, including a description of the special
17	<u>licenses.</u>
18	(iv) The average years of staff experience in
19	working with substance use disorder treatment and
20	recovery.
21	(7) What is the cost structure of your drug and alcohol
22	treatment facility or drug and alcohol recovery house and
23	what does the cost structure include based on the following?
24	(i) Daily, weekly or monthly cost.
25	(ii) Additional cost for treatment or board that is
26	not included in subparagraph (i).
27	(8) Which of the following do you accept as payment?
28	(i) Private insurance, including each insurance
29	plan.
30	(ii) Medicare or Medicaid.

1	(9) Is financial assistance available? If so, describe
2	the financial assistance available.
3	(10) What specific substance use diagnoses do you
4	accept? If you do not accept all substance use diagnoses,
5	which are excluded?
6	(11) Are you a dual diagnosis drug and alcohol treatment
7	facility or drug and alcohol recovery house accepting
8	patients with co-occurring mental health issues? If so, do
9	you exclude any specific mental health diagnoses? If so,
10	which mental health diagnoses do you exclude?
11	(12) Describe how you manage security and ensure the
12	safety of all residents.
13	(13) Have there been any reportable incidents of
14	violence in your drug and alcohol treatment facility or drug
15	and alcohol recovery house during the previous year?
16	(14) How are incidents of violence at your drug and
17	alcohol treatment facility or drug and alcohol recovery house
18	managed?
19	(15) Has any employee of your drug and alcohol treatment
20	facility or drug and alcohol recovery house been the subject
21	of a complaint regarding making threats against a patient or
22	resident during the previous year?
23	(16) What level of support does your drug and alcohol
24	treatment facility or drug and alcohol recovery house provide
25	based on the standard for recovery residences established by
26	National Alliance for Recovery Residences?
27	(17) Which standards under paragraph (16) have you not
28	<pre>yet attained?</pre>
29	(18) Do you accept individuals who are pursuing
30	medication-assisted recovery regimes? If so, how are the

2	(19) How often are individuals directly treated by a
3	licensed substance use disorder or mental health expert?
4	(20) How often are individual sessions conducted at your
5	drug and alcohol treatment facility or drug and alcohol
6	recovery house?
7	(21) How often are group sessions conducted at your drug
8	and alcohol treatment facility or drug and alcohol recovery
9	house?
10	(22) Is contact with a primary care doctor established
11	at your drug and alcohol treatment facility or drug and
12	alcohol recovery house? If a patient or resident does not
13	have a primary care doctor, do you introduce the patient or
14	resident to a primary care doctor?
15	(23) How often are individuals who require mental health
16	treatment seen by a medical doctor, psychiatrist or
17	psychologist?
18	(24) Is access to Narcotics Anonymous or Alcoholics
19	Anonymous meetings provided at your drug and alcohol
20	treatment facility or drug and alcohol recovery house? If so,
21	how often? Is transportation provided to the location of
22	Narcotics Anonymous or Alcoholics Anonymous meetings?
23	(25) What additional treatment or activities do you
24	provide at your drug and alcohol treatment facility or drug
25	and alcohol recovery house? For example, do you provide art
26	therapy, writing/poetry therapy, music therapy, exercise
27	therapy, yoga, acupuncture therapy, contact with religious
28	organizations for attending services, etc.? Is transportation
29	provided to the location of the additional treatment or
30	activities?

2	after they leave your drug and alcohol treatment facility or
3	drug and alcohol recovery house? If so, describe the formal
4	program, including whether the formal program assists
5	residents in finding an appropriate next residence, relapse
6	prevention, life skill training, etc.
7	(27) What is the average length of stay per resident at
8	the drug and alcohol treatment facility or drug and alcohol
9	recovery house during the previous year?
_0	(28) Do you track the ongoing wellness of residents who
1	have received treatment at your drug and alcohol treatment
_2	facility or drug and alcohol recovery house? If so, what is
13	the average consecutive days of wellness per resident during
4	the previous year? What is the average consecutive days of
15	wellness per resident for residents pursuing medication-
16	assisted recovery regimes during the previous year? What is
17	the average consecutive days of wellness per resident for
8	residents not pursuing medication-assisted recovery regimes

20	(29) How many patients or residents suffered relapses or
21	overdoses while in your drug and alcohol treatment facility
22	or drug and alcohol recovery house during the previous year?
23	(30) How many patients or residents suffered death while
24	in your drug and alcohol treatment facility or drug and
25	alcohol recovery house during the previous year?
26	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
