A RESOLUTION

Recognizing the week of May 12 through 18, 2013, as "National Police Week" and May 6, 2013, as "Police Officers' Memorial 1 2 Day" in Pennsylvania. 3 4 WHEREAS, Since the beginning of law enforcement within this Commonwealth, approximately 774 police officers have made the 5 6 ultimate sacrifice while in the line of duty, including the 7 following officers who died in 2012: Trooper First Class Blake T. Coble, Pennsylvania State Police; Police Officer Bradley M. 8 9 Fox, Plymouth Township Police Department; Patrolman Avery Freeman, Chester Police Department; Police Officer Brian 10 Lorenzo, Philadelphia Police Department and Police Officer Moses 11 12 Walker, Jr., Philadelphia Police Department; and 13 WHEREAS, Across the United States the week of May 12 through 18, 2013, will be recognized as "National Police Week"; and 14 15 WHEREAS, The first National Police Officers' Memorial Day was

held on May 15, 1982, following a proclamation signed by 1 President John F. Kennedy on October 1, 1962, and has continued 2 to be observed annually in memory of those police officers who 3 made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty; therefore be it 4 5 RESOLVED, That the Senate honor the memory of the hundreds of police officers who have given their lives in the line of duty 6 in this Commonwealth; and be it further 7 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the week of May 12 8

9 through 18, 2013, as "National Police Week" and May 6, 2013, as 10 "Police Officers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania.
