## A RESOLUTION

- Congratulating The Pennsylvania State University wrestling team on its 11th National Collegiate Athletic Association Division I Championship and Pennsylvania residents who competed and
- 4 placed during the National Collegiate Athletic Association
- 5 Division I Wrestling Championship.
- 6 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University wrestling team won
- 7 its 10th National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA)
- 8 Division I Wrestling Championship in the past 12 Championship
- 9 Tournaments, its second consecutive championship and 11th team
- 10 title overall; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University's 55.0-point
- 12 margin of victory was the largest in school history, beating the
- 13 previous record of 41.0 set in 2019, and fifth largest in NCAA
- 14 history; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University wrestling team
- 16 tied its previous school record of eight All-Americans in a
- 17 single season and won the Big Ten Championship; and
- 18 WHEREAS, At 34 individual first-place finishes, The
- 19 Pennsylvania State University wrestling team has won the most

- 1 individual titles in the nation since 2011, nearly tripling the
- 2 wins of the next closest competitor; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University featured for the
- 4 first time seven total wrestlers who finished in the top three
- 5 in their respective weight classes; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University Wrestling Head
- 7 Coach Cael Sanderson and his coaching staff won their 10th NCAA
- 8 Division I Wrestling Championship; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Nittany Lion wrestling team coaching staff has
- 10 been instrumental in the team's multiple successes; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Coach Sanderson was named Big Ten Coach of the Year
- 12 for the seventh time; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Coach Sanderson has personally coached 83, or more
- 14 than one-third, of the 246 All-Americans to ever wrestle for The
- 15 Pennsylvania State University; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Coach Sanderson's championship wrestlers have a 34-
- 17 16 record, or a 68% winning percentage, in the NCAA Wrestling
- 18 Tournament Finals; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Since 2011, The Pennsylvania State University
- 20 wrestlers have won 34 individual titles, approximately 28.8% of
- 21 all individual titles won in the NCAA Championship Tournament;
- 22 and
- 23 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University is the only team
- 24 since Coach Sanderson's arrival in 2011 with at least one victor
- 25 from each individual weight class in the NCAA Championship
- 26 Tournament; and
- 27 WHEREAS, In his fourth appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 28 Tournament, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Roman
- 29 Bravo-Young placed second in the 133-pound division after
- 30 placing first in all three previous appearances; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Roman
- 2 Bravo-Young earned the All-American distinction for the fifth
- 3 time making him the University's second-ever five-time All-
- 4 American and placed first in the 133-pound final of the Big Ten
- 5 Tournament for the third time; and
- 6 WHEREAS, In his second appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 7 Tournament, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Beau
- 8 Bartlett placed third in the 141-pound division; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Beau
- 10 Bartlett earned the All-American distinction for the first time;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, In his first appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 13 Tournament, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Shayne
- 14 Van Ness placed third in the 149-pound division; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Shayne
- 16 Van Ness earned the All-American distinction for the first time;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, In his first appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 19 Tournament, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Levi
- 20 Haines placed second in the 157-pound division; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Levi
- 22 Haines earned the All-American distinction for the first time,
- 23 was a true freshman Big Ten Champion and honored as the Big Ten
- 24 Freshman of the Year, making him The Pennsylvania State
- 25 University's eighth honoree; and
- 26 WHEREAS, In his third appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 27 Tournament, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Carter
- 28 Starocci won his third NCAA wrestling title in the 174-pound
- 29 division making him The Pennsylvania State University's fifth
- 30 three-time NCAA Champion; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Carter
- 2 Starocci earned the All-American distinction for the third time
- 3 and placed first in the 174-pound final of the Big Ten
- 4 Tournament for the second time; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In his third appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 6 Tournament, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Aaron
- 7 Brooks won his third NCAA wrestling title in the 184-pound
- 8 division making him The Pennsylvania State University's sixth
- 9 three-time NCAA Champion; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Aaron
- 11 Brooks earned the All-American distinction for the fourth time
- 12 making him The Pennsylvania State University's 17th four-time
- 13 All-American and placed first in the 184-pound final of the Big
- 14 Ten Tournament for the third time; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University has won eight
- 16 individual titles at the 184-pound division since 2011; and
- 17 WHEREAS, In his second appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 18 Tournament, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Max Dean
- 19 placed seventh in the 197-pound division after placing first in
- 20 the previous year's appearance; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Max Dean
- 22 earned the All-American distinction for the fourth time making
- 23 him The Pennsylvania State University's 18th four-time All-
- 24 American; and
- 25 WHEREAS, In his third appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 26 Tournament, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Greq
- 27 Kerkvliet placed second in the 285-pound division; and
- 28 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University wrestler Greg
- 29 Kerkvliet earned the All-American distinction for the third
- 30 time; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Twenty of the 80 All-Americans in the 2022-2023 NCAA
- 2 wrestling season either wrestled for a Pennsylvania university
- 3 or are Pennsylvania natives; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Nino Bonaccorsi, from Bethel Park, Trent Hidlay,
- 5 from Lewistown, Mikey Labriola, from Easton, Ethan Laird, from
- 6 McKean, Spencer Lee, from Murrysville, Max Murin, from
- 7 Ebensburg, Sammy Sasso, from Nazareth, Ed Scott, from Dubois,
- 8 and Ethan Smith, from Latrobe, are Pennsylvania natives who
- 9 wrestled in the 2022-2023 NCAA Championship Tournament and
- 10 earned the distinction of All-American; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Will Feldkamp, who wrestled for Clarion University
- 12 of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education, Josh
- 13 Humphreys, who wrestled for Lehigh University, and Anthony Noto,
- 14 who wrestled for Lock Haven University of Pennsylvania's State
- 15 System of Higher Education, competed at the 2022-2023 NCAA
- 16 Championship Tournament; and
- 17 WHEREAS, In his fourth appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 18 Tournament, The Ohio State University wrestler Sammy Sasso
- 19 placed second in the 149-pound division; and
- 20 WHEREAS, In his fourth appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 21 Tournament, Lehigh University wrestler Josh Humphreys placed
- 22 third in the 157-pound division; and
- 23 WHEREAS, In his fourth appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 24 Tournament, University of Nebraska wrestler Mikey Labriola
- 25 placed second in the 174-pound division; and
- 26 WHEREAS, In his fourth appearance at the NCAA Championship
- 27 Tournament, University of Pittsburgh wrestler Nino Bonaccorsi
- 28 won his first NCAA wrestling title in the 197-pound division;
- 29 therefore be it

- 1 University wrestling team on its 11th National Collegiate
- 2 Athletic Association Division I Championship and Pennsylvania
- 3 residents who competed and placed during the National Collegiate

- 7 Brooks and Carter Starocci on their individual wins at the

- 11 University wrestling team, all Pennsylvania native wrestlers and
- 12 all wrestlers of Pennsylvania universities continued success
- 13 both athletically and academically in the future.
