1 Honoring the life of Fire Chief Rodney Paul Miller, who died on
2 April 27, 2013.

3 WHEREAS, Rodney Paul Miller, Fire Chief of Loganville Fire
4 Company in Loganville, York County, died on April 27, 2013, in
5 the line of duty; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Miller began his service as a Junior Volunteer
7 Firefighter at 16 years of age, rising through the ranks to
8 become 1st Assistant Fire Chief, and ultimately Chief in 2001;
9 and

10 WHEREAS, Mr. Miller was born on February 6, 1968, in York,
11 attended Dallastown Area School District and graduated from York
12 County Area Vocational-Technical School, Class of 1986; and

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Miller was a tool and die maker by trade and was
14 a self-employed carpenter and mason who enjoyed hunting and

1 mentoring young firefighters; and

2 WHEREAS, Mr. Miller was a member of Salem United Church of
3 Christ in Jacobus, and was an active member of the Loganville
4 Fire Company, the Seven Valleys Community Fire Company and the
5 Fire Chiefs Association; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Miller is survived by his wife of 21 years,
7 Michelle D. "Shelly" (Keener) Miller; his parents, Paul T. and
8 Elaine M. (Thoman) Miller of Seven Valleys; his brother, Gary L.
9 Miller and his wife Julie of Spring Grove; three nieces, Lindsay
10 M. Miller, Madison M. Luring and Mariah E. Luring; and a nephew,
11 Kyle A. Miller; and

12 WHEREAS, A funeral service will be held Friday, May 3, 2013,
13 at Grace Fellowship Church in York, and Mr. Miller will be laid
14 to rest in St. Peter's Yellow Church Cemetery in Seven Valleys
15 and fireman's rites will be conducted by several fire
16 departments; and

17 WHEREAS, Rodney P. Miller served his Commonwealth and
18 community with courage and distinction; therefore be it
