A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the 75th anniversary of the Civil Air Patrol Cadet
2 Program.

3 WHEREAS, The Senate takes great pride in recognizing those
4 organizations which, through adherence to the highest standards
5 of volunteer service, contribute in a meaningful way toward a
6 better and more productive society; and

7 WHEREAS, The Civil Air Patrol (CAP) and Pennsylvania Wing
8 Civil Air Patrol are celebrating the momentous occasion of the
9 75th anniversary of the Civil Air Patrol Cadet Program, created
10 in December 1942; and

11 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania Wing has pursued the Civil Air Patrol's
12 Cadet Program mission with excellence in this Commonwealth
13 throughout the past 75 years and continues to do so today; and

14 WHEREAS, The proud and incredible heritage of the CAP Cadet
15 Program is a focus on developing America's youths to become
16 dynamic Americans, aerospace leaders and citizens of high

1 character who serve their nation, state, communities and fellow
2 citizens faithfully; and

3 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Wing Cadet Program includes the key
4 elements of leadership education, aerospace education, character
5 development and physical fitness; and

6 WHEREAS, CAP cadets gain first-hand experience in the
7 Learning, Leadership, Command and Executive phases of the Cadet
8 Program, progressively assuming increasing responsibilities for
9 personal leadership and leadership of others; and

10 WHEREAS, CAP cadets adhere to their cadet oath, which
11 concludes with their pledge to "advance my education and
12 training rapidly to prepare myself to be of service to my
13 community, state and nation"; and

14 WHEREAS, CAP cadets, along with their senior member adult
15 counterparts, train rigorously to attain emergency services
16 specialty qualifications and stand ready to engage in Civil Air
17 Patrol search and rescue and disaster relief and humanitarian
18 missions within this Commonwealth and across this nation; and

19 WHEREAS, CAP cadets learn and are taught by example to adhere
20 to the Civil Air Patrol core values of integrity, volunteer
21 service, excellence and respect; and

22 WHEREAS, Tens of thousands of young Pennsylvanians have
23 benefited from the education and experience gained through their
24 achievements in the CAP Cadet Program and now serve this
25 Commonwealth and our nation faithfully in all walks of life,
26 including military service, law enforcement, judicial service,
27 legislative service, education, industry, health care,
28 agriculture, transportation, trades and many others; and

29 WHEREAS, Cadet and senior members of Pennsylvania Wing are
30 scheduled to celebrate their achievements and communicate plans

1 for future service on May 10, 2017, "PA Wing Day" at the
2 Capitol; therefore be it

3 RESOLVED, That the Senate join with Pennsylvania Wing Civil
4 Air Patrol as it celebrates the joyous occasion of the 75th
5 anniversary of the Civil Air Patrol's Cadet Program; and be it
6 further

7 RESOLVED, That the Senate extend warmest wishes to the Civil
8 Air Patrol and Pennsylvania Wing Civil Air Patrol for a future
9 replete with ever-increasing success in service to this
10 Commonwealth, its communities and our nation; and be it further
