A RESOLUTION

Recognizing August 19, 2021, as "Aviation Day" in Pennsylvania. 1 2 WHEREAS, In 1903, brothers Orville and Wilbur Wright left their hometown of Dayton, Ohio, and traveled to the sands of 3 4 Kitty Hawk, North Carolina; and 5 WHEREAS, In Kitty Hawk, the Wright brothers made the first controlled, sustained flight of a powered, heavier-than-air 6 7 aircraft, and in the process established a tradition of excellence in innovation that endures to this day; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Declared in 1939 by President Franklin D. Roosevelt, 10 "National Aviation Day" celebrates the history and development of aviation; and 11 12 WHEREAS, This annual event provides an ideal time to pay 13 tribute to the many pioneering individuals who have dared to 14 reach for the heavens; and 15 WHEREAS, The date of August 19 was selected specifically to correspond with the birthday of Orville Wright, and this legacy 16

of the Wright brothers' historic flight helps to ensure that 1 2 important details of the past are transmitted to succeeding 3 generations for their reflection and appreciation; and WHEREAS, The many organizations and airports throughout this 4 Commonwealth that have participated in "National Aviation Day" 5 are to be commended for their tremendous efforts to guarantee 6 7 that the history of aviation in the United States will not be 8 forgotten; and

WHEREAS, Aviation in this Commonwealth dates back more than 9 10 100 years and currently ranks 16th in the country in the number of public-use aviation facilities; and 11

12 WHEREAS, With 124 airports, heliports and seaplane bases, 13 aviation provides an annual economic impact of \$28.5 billion to 14 this Commonwealth; and

15 WHEREAS, The aviation industry supports more than 322,000 jobs, making it one of the largest employment sectors in this 16 Commonwealth; and 17

18 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania-based companies, such as Lycoming Engines headquartered in northcentral Pennsylvania, have grown 19 20 over the years to employ hundreds of workers who specialize in the engineering, manufacturing, service and support of piston 21 aircraft engines; and 22

23 WHEREAS, The need for these jobs translates into expanded 24 curriculum at many Pennsylvania colleges in the field of 25 aviation maintenance and technology; and

26 WHEREAS, Residents of this Commonwealth and aviation enthusiasts are encouraged to celebrate the history of aviation 27 28 and support the future of aviation here in this Commonwealth; 29 therefore be it
