A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 Urging the Congress to take all necessary action to prohibit any
2 force structure changes, to prohibit any transfer of AH-64
3 Apache helicopters from the National Guard, and maintain the
4 Army National Guard at 350,200 soldiers until the National
5 Commission on the Future of the Army has reported its
6 findings; and urging the United States Army to reverse its
7 decision to deactivate the 55th Armored Brigade Combat Team,
8 and to reverse its decision to transfer any National Guard
9 AH-64 Apache helicopters to active duty.

10 WHEREAS, The United States Army plans to transfer all
11 National Guard AH-64 Apache helicopters to active duty as part
12 of the United States Army's Aviation Restructuring Initiative;
13 and

14 WHEREAS, The United States Army has marked Pennsylvania's
15 55th Armored Brigade Combat Team (ABCT) for inactivation; and

16 WHEREAS, The 55th ABCT is headquartered in Scranton, extends
17 over the eastern portion of Pennsylvania and approximately 3,500
18 Pennsylvanians serve with the 55th ABCT; and

19 WHEREAS, Congress established the National Commission on the

1 Future of the Army, which is tasked with completing an
2 independent study on the proper size, force mixture and force
3 generation requirements for the army, and this commission is
4 required to report its findings during February 2016; and

5 WHEREAS, This comprehensive assessment will provide
6 Congressional members the opportunity to review and legislate in
7 response to the commission's recommendations; and

8 WHEREAS, There are 24 AH-64 Apache helicopters authorized for
9 the Pennsylvania Army National Guard (PAARNG) with a significant
10 portion of the allotment stationed at the John Murtha Johnstown-
11 Cambria County Airport; and

12 WHEREAS, Transferring the Apache helicopters would result in
13 the loss of 350 part-time personnel from the 1-104th Attack
14 Battalion and the stationing of PAARNG is an important economic
15 driver in the Johnstown area with an estimated impact of nearly
16 \$45 million; and

17 WHEREAS, The economic necessity and the maintenance of
18 critical national defense units in the Johnstown area, including
19 the 1-104th Attack Battalion PAARNG and its complement of Apache
20 helicopters, dictates that the United States Army reverse its
21 decision to redeploy the helicopters; and

22 WHEREAS, Units from the 55th ABCT have deployed multiple
23 times since 9/11, including deployments to Kosovo, Kuwait,
24 Egypt, Iraq and Afghanistan and units from the brigade have
25 earned multiple Navy Unit Commendations and Meritorious Unit
26 Commendations; and

27 WHEREAS, The army's current force proposals reduce the total
28 Army National Guard end strength from 350,200 to 342,000 during
29 fiscal year 2016, and further, from 342,000 to 335,000 during
30 fiscal year 2017; and

1 WHEREAS, Since 2000, the army has cut the Army National Guard
2 by 14 Brigade Combat Teams and increased the active army by 12
3 Brigade Combat Teams, which have resulted in a shift from the
4 majority of force structure residing with the Army National
5 Guard to the majority of the force structure contained within
6 the active army; and

7 WHEREAS, The geographical location of Pennsylvania in
8 relation to the entire northeast corridor places the
9 Pennsylvania National Guard in a strategically accessible
10 position that can effectively respond at the Federal and State
11 level when needed for domestic emergencies or armed conflicts;
12 and

13 WHEREAS, The National Guard represents the best economic
14 value for the United States validated by the Department of
15 Defense stating in 2013 that a drilling guardsman is about 15%
16 the cost of an active component soldier; and

17 WHEREAS, When Title 10 mobilized duty, a national guard
18 soldier only costs 80 to 95% as much as an active component
19 soldier; therefore be it

20 RESOLVED, (the House of Representatives concurring), That the
21 General Assembly urge the United States Army to reverse its
22 decision to deactivate the 55th Armored Brigade Combat Team and
23 to reverse its decision to transfer any National Guard AH-64
24 Apache helicopters to active duty; and be it further

25 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly urge Congress to take all
26 necessary action to prohibit any force structure changes, to
27 prohibit any transfer of AH-64 Apache helicopters from the
28 National Guard, and maintain the Army National Guard at 350,200
29 soldiers until the National Commission on the Future of the Army
30 has reported its findings to Congress in February 2016-; AND BE <--
