A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing September 13, 2023, as "Celiac Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, September 13 has been nationally recognized as
- 4 "National Celiac Awareness Day"; and
- 5 WHEREAS, According to the Celiac Disease Foundation, celiac
- 6 disease is a serious autoimmune disease that occurs in
- 7 genetically predisposed people where the ingestion of gluten
- 8 leads to damage in the small intestine; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Celiac disease is estimated to impact 1 in 100
- 10 people worldwide and approximately 3 million Americans,
- 11 including more than 129,000 Pennsylvanians; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Researchers are finding that celiac disease
- 13 prevalence is doubling approximately every 15 years, making it a
- 14 growing public health concern; and
- 15 WHEREAS, For people with celiac disease, gluten, a protein
- 16 found in wheat, barley and rye, is poisonous; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Even a trace amount, such as a crumb, can trigger an

- 1 immune response leading the body to attack the small intestine;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, This intestinal damage can cause more than 200
- 4 debilitating symptoms; and
- 5 WHEREAS, According to the University of Chicago Celiac
- 6 Disease Center, gluten ingestion for people with celiac disease
- 7 causes permanent immunological scarring, doubles the risk of
- 8 heart disease and acts as a carcinogen, quadrupling the risk of
- 9 small intestinal cancers; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Celiac disease research is severely underfunded in
- 11 proportion to the scale of the disease, treatment burden and
- 12 lack of available treatment options; and
- 13 WHEREAS, According to an analysis published in 2017 by the
- 14 American Gastroenterological Association titled "Disparities
- 15 Among Gastrointestinal Disorders in Research Funding from the
- 16 National Institutes of Health," celiac disease receives the
- 17 lowest amount of National Institutes of Health funding over a
- 18 five-year period; and
- 19 WHEREAS, This funding averaged \$3 million annually or \$1 for
- 20 every person with celiac disease; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Celiac disease research also received the lowest
- 22 amount of National Institutes of Health grants; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Currently, a strictly gluten-free lifetime diet is
- 24 the only way to manage the disease, and this is inadequate given
- 25 that 80% of foods contain gluten, there is a constant risk of
- 26 cross-contamination and gluten is not required to be labeled on
- 27 packaged foods in the United States; and
- 28 WHEREAS, On April 26, 2023, the Food Labeling Modernization
- 29 Act of 2023 was introduced in the United States Congress,
- 30 legislation which would make gluten the 10th major food allergen

- 1 and require that gluten be labeled on all packaged foods in the
- 2 United States, bringing the country into alignment with 62 other
- 3 countries around the world, including Canada and across Europe;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, The connection between celiac disease and diet was
- 6 first established by Dr. Samuel Gee who wrote "if the patient
- 7 can be cured at all, it must be by means of diet"; and
- 8 WHEREAS, "Celiac Awareness Day" is observed each year on
- 9 September 13 to coincide with the birthday of Dr. Gee on
- 10 September 13, 1869; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is an
- 12 institution that can raise awareness for celiac disease with the
- 13 general public and the medical community; therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 15 recognize September 13, 2023, as "Celiac Awareness Day" in
- 16 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 18 encourage the 118th Congress to take action to support greater
- 19 funding for research into celiac disease; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 21 encourage the 118th Congress to pass the Food Labeling
- 22 Modernization Act of 2023; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 24 the presiding officers of each House of Congress and to each
- 25 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
