Amending the Rules of the Senate, further providing for order of business, for committee officers and for resolutions; and 2 providing for citations. 3 RESOLVED, That Rules 9, 15 and 29 of the Rules of the Senate 4 5 of Pennsylvania be amended to read: Rule 9. Order of Business. (a) General rule. -- The Order of Business to be observed in taking up business shall be as follows: 8 First 9 Call to Order. 10 Second Prayer by the Chaplain and 11 Pledge of Allegiance. 12 Third Reading of Communications. 13 Fourth Receiving reports of committees. 14 Fifth Asking of leaves of absence. No 15 Senator shall absent himself 16 without leave of the Senate, 17 first obtained, unless prevented 18 from attendance by sickness, or

29	(b) Special order of businessAny subject may, by a vote	
30	of a majority of the Members present, be made a special order;

- 3 Rule 15. Committee officers.
- 4 (a) Chair-ex-officio. -- The Chair of each standing committee
- 5 shall be ex-officio a member of each subcommittee that may be
- 6 established as part of the standing committee, with the right to
- 7 attend meetings of the subcommittee and vote on any matter
- 8 before the subcommittee.
- 9 (b) Calling committee to order.--The Chair or, if authorized
- 10 by the Chair, the Vice Chair, shall call the committee to order
- 11 at the hour provided by these Rules. Upon the appearance of a
- 12 quorum, the committee shall proceed with the order of business.
- 13 Any member of the committee may question the existence of a
- 14 quorum.
- 15 (c) Chair control of the committee room. -- The Chair or, if
- 16 authorized by the Chair, the Vice Chair, shall preserve order
- 17 and decorum and shall have general control of the committee
- 18 room. In case of a disturbance or disorderly conduct in the
- 19 committee room, the Chair or, if authorized by the Chair, the
- 20 Vice Chair, may cause the same to be cleared. The use of cell
- 21 phones and similar portable communication devices within any
- 22 Senate committee room by <u>individuals</u> other than members of the
- 23 Senate or their staffs is strictly prohibited.
- 24 (d) Chair's authority to sign documents and decide questions
- 25 of order.--The Chair shall sign all notices, vouchers, subpoenas
- 26 or reports required or permitted by these Rules. The Chair shall
- 27 decide all questions of order relative to parliamentary
- 28 procedure, subject to an appeal by any member of the committee.
- 29 (e) Vote of Chair, Vice Chair. -- The Chair and Vice Chair
- 30 shall vote on all matters before such committee; Provided, That

- 1 the name of the Chair shall be called last.
- 2 (f) Performance of duties by Vice Chair. -- Upon the death of
- 3 the Chair, the Vice Chair shall perform the duties of the office
- 4 until and unless the President Pro Tempore shall appoint a
- 5 successor. Upon and during disability, or incapacity of the
- 6 Chair, the Vice Chair shall perform the Chair's duties.
- 7 (g) Chair's duty to report. -- The Chair shall report any bill
- 8 to the Floor of the Senate not later than the next occurring
- 9 legislative day after the committee's vote to report it.
- 10 (h) Amendments.--Upon reporting the bill from committee, the
- 11 Chair shall submit all amendments adopted in committee to the
- 12 Secretary-Parliamentarian of the Senate for posting on the
- 13 Internet website maintained by the Senate.
- 14 Rule 29. Resolutions.
- 15 (a) Introduction. -- All resolutions, Senate and concurrent,
- 16 shall be introduced by presenting five copies of the Resolution,
- 17 with the sponsor identified, to the presiding officer.
- 18 (b) Consideration. -- The following resolutions, after being
- 19 read, shall be referred to an appropriate committee without
- 20 debate unless by unanimous consent the Senate shall otherwise
- 21 direct and, if favorably reported by the committee, shall lie
- 22 over one day for consideration, after which the resolutions may
- 23 be called up under the appropriate order of business:
- 24 (1) All Senate concurrent resolutions and House
- concurrent resolutions, excepting resolutions in reference to
- 26 adjournment sine die, recesses and resolutions recalling
- 27 bills from the Governor, which shall be regarded as
- 28 privileged.
- 29 (2) Resolutions containing calls for information from
- 30 the heads of departments or to alter the Rules.

- 1 (3) Resolutions giving rise to debate, except those that
- 2 relate to the disposition of matters immediately before the
- 3 Senate, those that relate to the business of the day on which
- 4 they were offered, and those that relate to adjournment sine
- 5 die or a recess.
- 6 (c) Printing in Senate History.--
- 7 (1) [Congratulatory resolutions and condolence
- 8 resolutions shall be given to the Secretary-Parliamentarian
- 9 and shall be considered under the order of unfinished
- business in the daily order of business.] (Reserved).
- 11 (2) All resolutions shall be adopted by a majority vote
- of the Senators present except as specifically provided for
- in these Rules.
- 14 (d) Joint Resolutions.--
- 15 (1) Joint resolutions shall be limited to constitutional
- amendments and shall be adopted by a vote of a majority of
- 17 the Senators elected to the Senate.
- 18 (2) A Joint resolution when passed by both Houses shall
- not be transmitted to the Governor for approval or
- disapproval but shall be filed in the Office of the Secretary
- of the Commonwealth in accordance with Article XI, section 1
- of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.
- FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Rules be amended by adding a rule
- 24 to read:
- 25 Rule 29.1. Citations.
- 26 (a) Preparation. -- A member making a request that a Senate
- 27 <u>Citation be issued to a particular person or on a specified</u>
- 28 occasion shall provide the Legislative Reference Bureau with the
- 29 facts necessary for the preparation of the citation on a
- 30 suitable form.

- 1 (b) Filing. -- The citation request shall be filed with the
- 2 <u>Secretary-Parliamentarian of the Senate and automatically</u>
- 3 referred to the President Pro Tempore, who may approve and sign
- 4 the citation on behalf of the Senate.
- 5 (c) Issuance. -- One original citation shall be issued by the
- 6 <u>Secretary-Parliamentarian of the Senate.</u>
