A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and achievements of former Pennsylvania
- 2 Governor and United States Attorney General Richard "Dick"
- 3 Lewis Thornburgh.
- 4 WHEREAS, Richard "Dick" Lewis Thornburgh passed away December
- 5 31, 2020, at 88 years of age; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Mr. Thornburgh was born in Pittsburgh, Allegheny
- 7 County, on July 16, 1932, the son of Charles G. and Alice
- 8 Sanborn Thornburgh; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Mr. Thornburgh attended Pittsburgh area schools,
- 10 Yale University, where he earned a degree in engineering in
- 11 1954, and the University of Pittsburgh, where he earned a law
- 12 degree with honors; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Thornburgh holds 31 honorary degrees from
- 14 various colleges and universities; and
- 15 WHEREAS, In 1958, Mr. Thornburgh became a member of the
- 16 Pennsylvania Bar and worked in a private law practice for

- 1 several years; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Mr. Thornburgh served as a delegate to
- 3 Pennsylvania's constitutional convention in 1967-1968; and
- WHEREAS, In 1969, the Nixon Administration appointed Mr.
- 5 Thornburgh as the United States attorney for the Western
- 6 District of Pennsylvania, where he earned a reputation as an
- 7 anti-racketeering prosecutor and enforcer of the Federal
- 8 Organized Crime Control Act; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Mr. Thornburgh held this post until 1975 when
- 10 President Gerald R. Ford appointed him assistant attorney
- 11 general for the Justice Department's Criminal Division, which he
- 12 held until 1977, when he returned to private practice; and
- 13 WHEREAS, In 1979, Mr. Thornburgh began his term as Governor
- 14 of Pennsylvania, a position he held until 1987; and
- 15 WHEREAS, During his tenure as Governor, Mr. Thornburgh
- 16 achieved numerous accomplishments and improved our Commonwealth
- 17 on a variety of issues, including a stronger economy and the
- 18 creation of thousands of new jobs in the service and technology
- 19 job sectors; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Thornburgh launched the Ben Franklin
- 21 Partnership, an alliance among government, private industry and
- 22 research universities to foster high-tech enterprises, which
- 23 for nearly four decades has been successfully energizing the
- 24 innovation and entrepreneurial ecosystem across our
- 25 Commonwealth; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Mr. Thornburgh is credited with creating a Small
- 27 Business Action Center, increasing funding for the Pennsylvania
- 28 Industrial Development Authority, implementing a customized job
- 29 training program, a new travel and tourism initiative and
- 30 spending \$20 billion for improvements in infrastructure; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Thornburgh administration's fiscal policies
- 2 resulted in balanced budgets, cuts to personal and corporate
- 3 income taxes, creation of a "rainy day" fund and reductions to
- 4 the Commonwealth's long-term indebtedness resulting in better
- 5 credit ratings; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Mr. Thornburgh is also credited with consolidating
- 7 State-owned universities into an independent State System of
- 8 Higher Education and creating several "Governor's Schools" for
- 9 exceptional high school students; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In March 1979, Mr. Thornburgh's defining moment came
- 11 just two months into office when he was confronted with the
- 12 worst nuclear accident in American history; and
- 13 WHEREAS, In later years, Mr. Thornburgh was praised for
- 14 handling the 10-day crisis by many, including recognition by the
- 15 Republican Governors Association; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Following Mr. Thornburgh's tenure as Governor, he
- 17 taught at Harvard University and served as Director of the
- 18 Institute of Politics from 1987 to 1988, served as United States
- 19 Attorney General from 1998 to 1991 under Presidents Ronald W.
- 20 Reagan and George H. W. Bush, until President George H. W. Bush
- 21 appointed him Under-Secretary-General of the United Nations,
- 22 where he served from from 1992 to 1993; and
- 23 WHEREAS, As United States Attorney General, Mr. Thornburgh
- 24 played a proactive role in the strengthening and enforcement of
- 25 the Americans with Disabilities Act and against racial,
- 26 religious and ethnic hate crimes; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Following Mr. Thornburgh's role as Attorney General
- 28 and Under-Secretary-General of the United Nations, he returned
- 29 to private practice and served as an advisor and counselor to
- 30 government affairs clients with respect to matters concerning

- 1 Federal, State and local governments as well as international
- 2 organizations; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Mr. Thornburgh was married to the former Virginia
- 4 (Ginny) Judson and has four sons; Peter, David, John and
- 5 William, six grandchildren and four great-grandchildren;
- 6 therefore be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Senate honor the life and achievements of
- 8 former Pennsylvania Governor and United States Attorney General
- 9 Richard "Dick" Lewis Thornburgh.
