A RESOLUTION

1 Designating the month of October 2015 as "Attention Deficit
2 Hyperactivity Disorder Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, More than six million people, or 11% of school-age
4 children and 4% of adults, in the United States have been
5 diagnosed with attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD);
6 and

7 WHEREAS, ADHD is one of the most common childhood disorders
8 and can continue through adolescence and adulthood; and

9 WHEREAS, ADHD is a nondiscriminatory disorder affecting
10 people of every age, gender, race, IQ, religion and
11 socioeconomic background; therefore be it

12 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of October 2015
13 as "Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder Awareness Month" in
14 Pennsylvania.
