A RESOLUTION

Recognizing the month of September 2019 as "Hunger Action Month" 1 in Pennsylvania. 2 3 WHEREAS, September 2019 has been designated as "Hunger Action 4 Month" to provide a unified opportunity for communities in the 5 United States to focus attention on the persistent problem of 6 domestic hunger and to mobilize and create a movement to help 7 end hunger in America; and 8 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Agriculture gathers 9 information and provides statistics related to domestic hunger; 10 and 11 WHEREAS, According to a study published by Feeding America, 12 in 2017, 12% or nearly 1.6 million Pennsylvanians, including 13 437,340 children, did not always know where they would find 14 their next meal; and 15 WHEREAS, Many Pennsylvania households experience hunger, and some people in these households frequently skip meals or eat too 16 little, sometimes going without food for a whole day; and 17 WHEREAS, Research shows that preschool and school-age 18

children who experience severe hunger have higher levels of 1 2 chronic illness, anxiety and depression and behavioral problems 3 than children receiving a well-balanced diet; and WHEREAS, Food insecure seniors have lower nutrient intakes 4 than food secure seniors, and, without proper nutrients, seniors 5 are at increased risk of disability, deteriorated health 6 conditions, decreased resistance to infections, lengthened 7 8 hospital stays, deteriorated mental health and being 9 underweight; and

10 WHEREAS, The costs of other essentials, such as home heating, 11 housing and medical care, have increased significantly, and for 12 families caught in the squeeze between declining wages and 13 rising costs, the food budget becomes a frequent pressure point; 14 and

15 WHEREAS, Utilization of emergency food assistance becomes a 16 way for these individuals and families to keep food on the table 17 while still paying the bills; and

18 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania food banks serve nearly 2 million 19 people annually, including more than 430,000 children and more 20 than 360,000 senior citizens; and

21 WHEREAS, Individuals, charities, businesses and the 22 government all have a role to play in getting food to those in 23 need; and

24 WHEREAS, Food banks, food rescue organizations, soup 25 kitchens, food pantries, faith-based organizations, businesses 26 and individuals are donating time, raising funds and giving food 27 to help their neighbors; and

28 WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians benefiting from the nutrition 29 assistance programs and services range from infants and toddlers 30 to school-age children and adolescents, single parents, two-
