## A RESOLUTION

- Honoring freedom fighters in recognition of their vast and valiant efforts to ensure the civil rights of individuals
- across the globe.
- 4 WHEREAS, The protection of civil rights and civil liberties
- 5 is essential to the well-being of a free and democratic society;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has a diverse population whose
- 8 contributions to this Commonwealth are vital to its economy,
- 9 culture and civic character; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The dangerous rhetoric espoused by individuals and
- 11 groups who wish to threaten this diverse population pose a
- 12 particular threat to the civil rights and liberties of the
- 13 residents of our Commonwealth; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Throughout history, freedom fighters have worked to
- 15 protect individuals and groups from political repression and
- 16 discrimination by governments and private organizations; and
- 17 WHEREAS, These influential figures have sought to ensure the
- 18 ability of all members of society to participate in civil and

- 1 political life; and
- 2 WHEREAS, By engaging in resistance movements against
- 3 oppressive and illegitimate governments, freedom fighters have
- 4 promoted and implemented political freedom and the expansion of
- 5 personal civil liberties and rights; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Although the term "freedom fighter" is sometimes co-
- 7 opted to describe those engaged in terrorism or insurrection,
- 8 freedom fighters are better described as revolutionists and
- 9 abolitionists that overcome obstacles to freedom; and
- 10 WHEREAS, We must recognize the courage and tenacity of
- 11 freedom fighters such as LGBTQIA+ activists Frank Kameny and
- 12 Marsha P. Johnson, holocaust survivor and human rights champion
- 13 Elie Wiesel, anti-apartheid activist Desmond Tutu and Pakistani
- 14 education activist Malala Yousafzai; and
- 15 WHEREAS, It is more important now than ever before to learn
- 16 from the accomplishments and contributions of freedom fighters,
- 17 mirroring their efforts to overcome obstacles that continue to
- 18 prevent Pennsylvanians and citizens around the globe from
- 19 achieving true freedom; therefore be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Senate honor the freedom fighters that
- 21 have put their lives on the line to defend the dignity of
- 22 repressed entities worldwide.
