A RESOLUTION

Recognizing the month of October 2017 as "National Breast Cancer 1 Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania and October 20, 2017, as 2 "National Mammography Day" in Pennsylvania. 3 WHEREAS, "National Breast Cancer Awareness Month" was founded 4 5 in 1985 and has since evolved into a collaboration of national public service organizations, professional medical associations 6 7 and government agencies working together to promote breast 8 cancer awareness, share information on the disease and provide 9 greater access to services; and 10 WHEREAS, Since its inception more than 30 years ago, the "National Breast Cancer Awareness Month" effort has stood at the 11 12 forefront of promoting awareness of breast cancer issues; and 13 WHEREAS, Much remains to be done to educate women and men 14 about breast health in order to empower them to take charge of 15 their health through practicing regular breast self-exams to identify changes, scheduling regular doctor visits and 16 mammograms as recommended, adhering to prescribed treatment and 17

1 knowing the facts about recurrence; and

2 WHEREAS, An important part of raising awareness involves 3 helping people to understand the importance of screening and 4 detecting cancer in its early stages so that treatment can 5 occur, increasing survival rates and healing and decreasing 6 suffering; and

7 WHEREAS, A mammogram serves as a screening test that can8 detect breast cancer early; and

9 WHEREAS, Screening for breast cancer for women 40 years of 10 age or older through mammograms helps to ensure early detection 11 of breast cancer; and

12 WHEREAS, "National Mammography Day" has existed since 1993 13 when President Bill Clinton first proclaimed the third Friday of 14 October as "National Mammography Day" to encourage women, 15 particularly those in high-risk groups, to make a mammography 16 appointment during the month of October; and

WHEREAS, Raising breast cancer awareness remains an important issue; and

19 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that in 2016 20 in the United States 246,660 new cases of invasive breast cancer were diagnosed in women, 40,450 women died from breast cancer, 21 2,600 new cases of invasive breast cancer were diagnosed in men 22 23 and 440 men died from breast cancer; therefore be it 24 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the month of October 25 2017 as "National Breast Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it further 26

27 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize October 20, 2017, as
28 "National Mammography Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
29 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge all women and men in this
30 Commonwealth to have discussions with their doctors about breast

cancer, particularly about the value of getting screened for
 breast cancer, especially if possible signs of breast cancer are
 detected; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage women in this
Commonwealth 40 years of age or older to undergo annual
mammograms and urge women 55 years of age or older to recognize
the benefit of undergoing mammograms every two years; and be it
further

9 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge residents to take action 10 during the month of October and throughout the year to help 11 people remain informed about the incidence of breast cancer and 12 how residents of this Commonwealth can protect themselves from 13 the disease and take proper action if breast cancer develops.
