A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the week of October 13 through 19, 2013, as "Homeless Children's Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Homeless Children's Awareness Week will bring
4	attention to the growing problems and issues children
5	experiencing homelessness face throughout this Commonwealth and
6	across the nation; and
7	WHEREAS, The National Law Center on Homelessness and Poverty
8	estimates as many as 2 million people will experience
9	homelessness this year and about half of them will include
10	children and youth; and
11	WHEREAS, The Federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act
12	states that children are homeless if they lack a fixed, regular
13	and adequate nighttime residence; and
14	WHEREAS, Children of all ages are negatively impacted by
15	homelessness in the areas of physical health, emotional and
16	behavioral development and academic success; and

WHEREAS, Children are the fastest growing segment of the
homeless population; and

3 WHEREAS, During the 2011-2012 school year, over 19,000 school age children and youth were reported as experiencing 4 homelessness which made up about 1% of the total Pennsylvania 5 public school enrollment population for that year; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Youth experiencing homelessness face several obstacles, including frequent moves which disrupt their 8 education, making them twice as likely to repeat a grade; and 9 WHEREAS, The National Coalition for the Homeless cites 10 studies that show youth experiencing homelessness are set back 11 12 academically three to six months; and

13 WHEREAS, The national school dropout rate for children facing 14 homelessness is 60% higher than for a child who does not have 15 that experience during the school year; and

16 WHEREAS, For more than a decade, the Homeless Children's Education Fund has been working to ensure that children facing 17 18 homelessness have access to the same educational opportunities 19 as other kids, in an effort to combat such statistics; and 20 WHEREAS, Many events will take place during Homeless 21 Children's Awareness Week in Pittsburgh, including an intimate storytelling event, a performance art installation and a 5K and 22 23 10K run/walk for homeless children in North Park; and 24 WHEREAS, Individuals and groups across this Commonwealth are 25 encouraged to create their own events during Homeless Children's 26 Awareness Week to raise awareness about the needs and challenges of children and youth experiencing homelessness in this 27

28 Commonwealth; therefore be it
