A RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4	Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a study relating to the feasibility and cost- effectiveness of merging public school district health care plans.
5	WHEREAS, There is increasing concern among the citizen
6	taxpayers of this Commonwealth over the rising cost of education
7	in our public schools; and
8	WHEREAS, School board members and business managers have
9	noted that the costs of benefits, particularly those related to
10	health care, are among the fastest growing expenditures in a
11	district's budget and this problem is particularly acute in
12	rapidly growing and urban districts; and
13	WHEREAS, The size and composition of an insured group
14	directly impacts the costs of coverage, with larger groups being
15	afforded better rates; and
16	WHEREAS, The extent of health benefit coverage provided to
17	school employees is currently negotiated locally, with the
18	result that the State has no control over the growth in these

1 expenditures; and

2 WHEREAS, It is critical to assure taxpayers that governmental 3 agencies are providing services in an efficient and cost-4 effective manner BASED ON A THOROUGH EXAMINATION OF EXISTING 5 SCHOOL ENTITY INSURANCE POLICIES AND CONTRACTS, INCLUDING 6 REGIONAL DIFFERENCES, so as to provide maximum utilization of 7 taxpayer dollars; therefore be it

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8 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee 9 be directed to conduct a study relating to the practicability 10 and potential cost-effectiveness of merging public school 11 employees under the same group health benefits package; and be 12 it further

13 RESOLVED, That for the purposes of this study, health 14 benefits include medical, dental, vision and prescription drug 15 programs and that this study include:

16 (1) An A DETAILED analysis of the specific health
17 benefits, POLICIES AND CONTRACTS currently provided by OR
18 OPERATED BY AT LEAST 50% OF THE school entities throughout
19 this Commonwealth, the premium costs related thereto and the
20 pattern of growth in these costs.

(2) Cost of current benefits for the next five years.
(3) Cost of current school employee contribution or
average per employee.

24 (4) Impact on the Public School Employees' Retirement
25 System and State Employees' Retirement System.

26 (5) Comparison of coverage with average taxpayer in the 27 relevant region.

28 (6) Regionalization versus one health care plan.

29 (7) Cost savings realized with consortiums compared to30 prior consortiums.

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(8) Administrative, staffing and technology costs
 associated with forming mergers.

3 (9) Comparison of school employees versus Commonwealth
4 employees.

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(10) Cost of least used benefits by school employees.

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(11) Cost impact of the Patient Protection and

9 RESOLVED, That in compiling this report the Legislative 10 Budget and Finance Committee seek input from the Department of 11 Education, the State Board of Education, the Pennsylvania Association of School Business Officials, the Pennsylvania 12 13 School Boards Association, the Pennsylvania State Education Association, the Pennsylvania Federation of Teachers, group 14 insurance providers and any other groups or individuals who may 15 16 have information relevant to this study; and be it further 17 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee report its findings and recommendations to the Senate no later 18 than June NOVEMBER 30, 2014. 19

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
