A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2024 as "Faith Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The United States of America was born of the
- 4 unanimous declaration that we are "endowed by [our] Creator with
- 5 certain unalienable Rights," based on "the Laws of Nature and of
- 6 Nature's God," "appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world,"
- 7 and acknowledging our "reliance on the protection of divine
- 8 Providence"; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Religious freedom is known as America's first
- 10 freedom, as laid out in the Establishment Clause and the Free
- 11 Exercise Clause of the First Amendment to the Constitution of
- 12 the United States; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The freedom of speech guaranteed by the First
- 14 Amendment to the Constitution of the United States also supports
- 15 America's unique focus on freedom of expression, including in
- 16 matters of faith; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Our motto "In God We Trust" further emphasizes the
- 18 importance of faith in our nation's founding; and

- 1 WHEREAS, From our first president to the last, we have
- 2 acknowledged America's faith, with President George Washington
- 3 recognizing "it is the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the
- 4 providence of Almighty God, to obey his will, to be grateful for
- 5 his benefits, and humbly to implore his protection and favor,"
- 6 and President Joe Biden most recently acknowledging Thanksgiving
- 7 as a "time to reflect on our many blessings from God, this
- 8 Nation, and each other"; and
- 9 WHEREAS, America's Judeo-Christian founding promotes
- 10 religious diversity and tolerance; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Religious liberty serves to strengthen our country's
- 12 appreciation of all peoples, regardless of faith; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Eternal diligence is needed to preserve religious
- 14 freedom; and
- WHEREAS, Attacks on religious liberty and people of faith
- 16 continue to plaque our nation, with some religious charities
- 17 even being forced to betray the tenets of their faith in order
- 18 to participate in certain government programs; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Many seek to criminalize religious beliefs in
- 20 certain controversial areas; and
- 21 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth's founder William Penn said "No
- 22 people can be truly happy, though under the greatest enjoyments
- 23 of civil liberties, if abridged of the freedom of their
- 24 consciences as to their religious profession and worship"; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Gouverneur Morris, a representative of this
- 26 Commonwealth at the constitutional convention said, "There must
- 27 be religion. When that ligament is torn, society is disjointed
- 28 and its members perish...[T]he most important of all lessons is
- 29 the denunciation of ruin to every state that rejects the
- 30 precepts of religion"; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Benjamin Rush, a representative of this Commonwealth
- 2 at the constitutional convention said, "I do not believe that
- 3 the Constitution was the offspring of inspiration, but I am as
- 4 satisfied that it is as much the work of a Divine Providence as
- 5 any of the miracles recorded in the Old and New Testament"; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Religious organizations in America have a rich
- 7 history of charitable engagement in helping the sick, poor and
- 8 afflicted; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2024
- 10 as "Faith Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage all residents of this
- 12 Commonwealth to share their faiths freely and openly and engage
- 13 in public displays and celebrations, including prayer and
- 14 expressions of thanksgiving, during the month of April.
