A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of February 2018 as "Benevolent and 1 Protective Order of Elks Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, On the 150th anniversary of the establishment of the
- Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, residents of this
- 5 Commonwealth celebrate the commitment of the Benevolent and
- 6 Protective Order of Elks and the Pennsylvania Elks State
- 7 Association to selflessly serve others in need across our great
- Commonwealth; and 8
- 9 WHEREAS, Founded in New York City on February 16, 1868, by
- 10 Charles Algernon Sidney Vivian and a handful of friends, the
- 11 Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks has spread across the
- 12 country, with nearly 1 million members and 2,000 lodges; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Dedicated to charity, justice and patriotism, the
- 14 Elks have invested millions of hours each year to build stronger
- 15 communities, assist homeless veterans and ensure that children
- 16 steer away from drugs; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Over the course of their history, the Elks have
- disbursed more than \$3.6 billion in cash, goods and services to 18

- 1 our nation's veterans, disadvantaged individuals, individuals
- 2 with disabilities and patriotic and civic programs; and
- 3 WHEREAS, In the last fraternal year, the Pennsylvania Elks
- 4 State Association raised \$6,989,884.94 for the following
- 5 purposes:
- 6 (1) scholarships;
- 7 (2) drug awareness;
- 8 (3) programs for military, veterans and homeless
- 9 veterans;
- 10 (4) youth basketball and soccer; and
- 11 (5) home nursing programs;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, Accordingly embedded in the fabric of our nation,
- 14 the Elks have steadfastly committed to honoring and serving
- 15 military members and veterans; and
- 16 WHEREAS, For more than a century, the Elks have pledged: "So
- 17 long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order
- 18 of the Elks will never forget them"; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Elks fulfill this promise daily by visiting and
- 20 providing social events and friendship to veterans receiving
- 21 treatment in medical facilities, hospitals and nursing homes
- 22 operated by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs;
- 23 and
- 24 WHEREAS, The Elks donate much-needed supplies and equipment
- 25 to these medical facilities, hospitals and nursing homes to
- 26 further ensure that veterans receive the care they deserve; and
- 27 WHEREAS, During World War I, the Elks donated at least \$2
- 28 million to assist American soldiers going abroad and organized,
- 29 constructed and equipped the first two American field hospitals
- 30 in France; and

- 1 WHEREAS, After World War I, the Elks built a 700-bed hospital
- 2 in Boston and donated the facility to the Federal Government;
- 3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, During that period, the Elks empowered nearly 50,000
- 5 disabled veterans to live full lives by providing
- 6 rehabilitation, vocation and education loans; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Education assistance given by the Elks was a
- 8 catalyst for passage of the GI Bill by the Congress of the
- 9 United States; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Elks were instrumental in raising funds for the
- 11 National World War II Memorial, having donated \$1.22 million to
- 12 its construction; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Elks have dedicated endless hours and resources
- 14 in support of youths and celebrating the accomplishments of our
- 15 nation's youths; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Committed to building up the next generation, the
- 17 Elks rank among the top three private providers of scholarships
- 18 for students; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Each year, millions of dollars donated by the Elks
- 20 are awarded to thousands of students who may pursue dreams of
- 21 becoming our nation's future leaders; and
- 22 WHEREAS, One of the most impressive Elks-sponsored youth
- 23 programs is the Elks National Hoop Shoot; and
- 24 WHEREAS, "Elks National Youth Week," observed each year
- 25 during the first week in May, recognizes young individuals for
- 26 their involvement with the achievements in the community; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The Elks truly make a difference in the lives of
- 28 many young individuals through their sponsorship of youth fairs,
- 29 career nights, student government days, athletic and education
- 30 programs, clubs and more; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks is the
- 2 fraternal organization most actively engaged in promoting strong
- 3 and healthy futures for young people; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The Elks National Drug Awareness Program is the
- 5 nation's largest volunteer-based drug prevention organization;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, Since 1982, the Elks have distributed 7 million
- 8 pieces of anti-drug educational materials to students, educators
- 9 and parents free of charge; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In partnership with the United States Drug
- 11 Enforcement Administration, the Elks produce an annual comic
- 12 book focused on empowering youths to make good decisions when
- 13 faced with negative social pressures such as bullying and drug
- 14 use; and
- WHEREAS, More than half a million copies of the comic book
- 16 are given to schools each year along with teacher's guides for
- 17 easy and effective classroom incorporation; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Last year, the Elks and the United States Drug
- 19 Enforcement Administration collaborated to produce a YouTube
- 20 video on the effects of drug use on an individual's physical
- 21 body, future education, career opportunities and relationships,
- 22 which has been viewed more than half a million times; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Members of the Pennsylvania Elks State Association
- 24 always put the needs of others before themselves, thus
- 25 comprising one of the first organizations on the ground during a
- 26 crisis to provide supplies and relief to affected individuals;
- 27 and
- 28 WHEREAS, The Elks raised more than \$1 million to help
- 29 families victimized by the horrific terrorist attacks of
- 30 September 11, 2001; and

- 1 WHEREAS, More recently, the Elks donated \$25,000 to persons
- 2 affected by Hurricane Harvey in Texas; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Since the earliest days of the Benevolent and
- 4 Protective Order of Elks, patriotism has further distinguished
- 5 the Elks from other fraternal organizations; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Elks have always revered the American flag and
- 7 the sacrifices made daily in its honor; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In 1907, the Elks adopted June 14 as "Flag Day"; and
- 9 WHEREAS, In 1911, the Elks made it mandatory that all lodges
- 10 observe "Flag Day" with appropriate ceremonies; and
- 11 WHEREAS, On August 3, 1949, President Harry S. Truman, a
- 12 member of the Elks, permanently designated June 14 as "Flag Day"
- 13 nationwide; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Prominent Elks who went on to achieve greatness in
- 15 public life include the following:
- 16 (1) Presidents Warren G. Harding, Franklin D. Roosevelt,
- Harry S. Truman, Dwight D. Eisenhower, John F. Kennedy and
- 18 Gerald R. Ford.
- 19 (2) United States Army Generals Douglas MacArthur,
- 20 George Patton and John Pershing.
- 21 (3) Hundreds of members of the Congress of the United
- 22 States;
- 23 therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the month of February
- 25 2018 as "Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks Month" in
- 26 Pennsylvania.
