## A RESOLUTION

1 2	Commemorating Pennsylvania's contribution to Operation Desert Shield and Operation Desert Storm.
3	WHEREAS, On August 2, 1990, the Iraqi Army, under orders of
4	Saddam Hussein, invaded and brutally occupied Kuwait; and
5	WHEREAS, The Iraqi attack was swift, with Baghdad ordering
6	the preponderance of its forces into Kuwait, which threatened
7	Saudi Arabia; and
8	WHEREAS, President George Herbert Walker Bush responded to
9	this invasion with a deployment of troops to the region, backed
10	by 256,000 Allied and Coalition military personnel; and
11	WHEREAS, The first portion of the deployment was called
12	Operation Desert Shield, which focused on the defense of Saudi
13	Arabia and the buildup of forces in the theater; and
14	WHEREAS, Operation Desert Storm encompassed offensive
15	operations to liberate Kuwait; and
16	WHEREAS, Operation Desert Storm began on January 16, 1991.

1 with a concerted air campaign to attrite the Iraqi forces

2 occupying Kuwait; and

3 WHEREAS, The Coalition ground campaign began on February 23, 4 1991, with the movement of the 2nd Armored Cavalry Regiment into 5 southeastern Iraq to lead the main attack against Saddam 6 Hussein's elite Guards Corps; and

7 WHEREAS, The general ground offensive kicked off in earnest 8 on February 24, 1991, and resulted in the complete liberation of 9 Kuwait by February 28, 1991; and

10 WHEREAS, Operation Desert Storm was a stunning display of 11 near perfection in conducting joint and combined military 12 operations based upon years of study to avoid the errors made by 13 leadership during the Vietnam War; and

14 WHEREAS, More importantly, Operation Desert Storm was the 15 single most important point of unification for the American 16 people since the Vietnam War; and

17 WHEREAS, The residents of this Commonwealth and our nation 18 were united in their support of military personnel, including a 19 spontaneous movement to prayer for protection of our deployed 20 troops, as well as an outpouring of generosity with care 21 packages; and

22 WHEREAS, Across Pennsylvania, this unique time for our nation 23 was observed with yellow ribbons decorating trees as a reminder 24 to pray for the safety of our men and women serving in Operation 25 Desert Storm; and

26 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's cost to liberate Kuwait was high, as 27 thousands of its sons and daughters served in Operation Desert 28 Storm; and

29 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania suffered the highest loss of life in a 30 single attack when an Iraqi scud missile exploded at Dhahran,

Saudi Arabia, killing 13 and wounding 43 members of the
Pennsylvania-based 14th Quartermaster Detachment; and
WHEREAS, May we never forget those who served during
Operation Desert Storm; and

5 WHEREAS, Let us pause and remember those from Pennsylvania 6 who paid the last full measure of devotion in the cause of 7 freedom; therefore be it
