A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of July 1 through 8, 2024, as "Gettysburg Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Between July 1 through 3, 1863, the Battle of
- 4 Gettysburg in Gettysburg took place between the Union Army of
- 5 the Potomac, led by General George G. Meade, and the Confederate
- 6 Army of Northern Virginia, led by General Robert E. Lee; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Battle of Gettysburg is considered the most
- 8 important engagement of the American Civil War as it was the
- 9 turning point for the North; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Leading up to the Battle of Gettysburg, the
- 11 Confederate Army was advancing toward Harrisburg with the
- 12 northernmost engagement in Hampden Township, Cumberland County;
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, On July 1, as both armies headed toward the Borough
- 15 of Gettysburg, the Army of Northern Virginia drove the Union
- 16 Army of the Potomac through town to Cemetery Hill located a half
- 17 mile to the south; and
- 18 WHEREAS, On July 2, the Army of Northern Virginia attacked

- 1 the Union Army of the Potomac, which stretched from the nest of
- 2 boulders known as Devil's Den into a peach orchard, as well as
- 3 in a nearby wheat field and on the slopes of Little Round Top;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, On July 3, the Army of Northern Virginia, via
- 6 "Pickett's Charge," attacked Cemetery Ridge but was ultimately
- 7 repelled by the Union Army; and
- 8 WHEREAS, On July 4, the Army of Northern Virginia withdrew
- 9 from Gettysburg; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Battle of Gettysburg was the battle with the
- 11 largest number of casualties in the American Civil War with
- 12 28,000 Confederate casualties and 23,000 Union casualties; and
- WHEREAS, On November 19, 1863, President Abraham Lincoln
- 14 delivered the Gettysburg Address at the dedication of the
- 15 Soldiers' National Cemetery; and
- 16 WHEREAS, More than 3,500 soldiers were buried at the
- 17 Soldiers' National Cemetery after losing their lives in the
- 18 battle; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Reconciliation between the north and the south began
- 20 at Gettysburg through warm and respectful post-war reunions that
- 21 featured peace walk reenactments of Pickett's Charge in 1887,
- 22 1913 and 1938; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The Gettysburg battlefield was designated as a
- 24 National Military Park in 1895; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The residents of Gettysburg helped to preserve the
- 26 land that now serves as the Gettysburg National Military Park,
- 27 including the Soldiers' National Cemetery and the Gettysburg
- 28 battlefield; and
- 29 WHEREAS, More than 1 million people travel each year to visit
- 30 the park, museum and visitor's center; therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of July 1
- 2 through 8, 2024, as "Gettysburg Week" in Pennsylvania; and be it
- 3 further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate commemorate the Battle of
- 5 Gettysburg during the Civil War; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the historical
- 7 significance of the outcome of the Battle of Gettysburg which
- 8 helped to preserve the United States; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage residents of this
- 10 Commonwealth to visit Gettysburg National Military Park.
