A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of May 2022 as "Trauma Awareness Month" and May 25, 2022, as "Trauma Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Trauma is the response a person has to a deeply
- 4 disturbing or stressful event that affects an individual's
- 5 ability to recover and impacts them mentally and/or physically;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, Being trauma informed recognizes the presence of
- 8 trauma which results from past traumatic experiences and the
- 9 role that it plays throughout someone's life; and
- 10 WHEREAS, On an organizational level, being trauma informed
- 11 changes organizational culture to emphasize respecting and
- 12 responding to the effects of trauma at all levels in peoples'
- 13 life, including experiences or trauma that affects their
- 14 identity, relationships with others and their world view; and
- WHEREAS, Healing in all policies is a must, but community
- 16 healing will only occur when we acknowledge the historical harms
- 17 done to individuals; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The effects of traumatic exposures on humans are

- 1 detailed in research over the last two decades from the evolving
- 2 sciences of neuroscience, molecular biology, public health,
- 3 genomics and epigenetics; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Research reveals experiences such as a community
- 5 trauma, individual trauma and pandemic trauma results in
- 6 significant impacts at the micro, meso and macro health system
- 7 levels; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Individuals and leaders of Pennsylvania must
- 9 understand and heal to move forward from the current trauma of
- 10 COVID-19; and
- 11 WHEREAS, We recognize that all individuals, not only
- 12 experience trauma from situations such as a pandemic, but also
- 13 due to ongoing social injustice practices; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The trauma awareness campaign will continue beyond
- 15 the month of May and lay the foundational groundwork for more
- 16 public/private partnerships in the future; and
- 17 WHEREAS, May 25 marks a historic chapter in advancing our
- 18 Commonwealth and improving the physical, mental and emotional
- 19 health of individuals in Pennsylvania; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is a pioneering state for becoming
- 21 healing centered; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Continued progress towards being healing centered in
- 23 communities, organizations, families and as individuals requires
- 24 reform in policies, practices and the current narrative; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The vital importance and full participation to
- 26 create a foundational unified front in awareness, resources and
- 27 healing for every individual in Pennsylvania to become trauma
- 28 informed is required; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania stands with the national movement,
- 30 #WeHealUS, to continue down our path to HEAL PA; and

- 1 WHEREAS, All individuals and leaders must recognize that
- 2 trauma exists and has widespread effects, recognize the signs
- 3 and symptoms of trauma and respond proactively and resist
- 4 retraumatization; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of May 2022 as
- 6 "Trauma Awareness Month" and May 25, 2022, as "Trauma Awareness
- 7 Day" in Pennsylvania.
