A RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Urging the President of the United States, White House staff and Federal public health officials to use the Federal Government's power to order the manufacturing of essential testing supplies, procure supplies for widespread testing and direct needed resources to states, including Pennsylvania, to mitigate additional exposure to COVID-19 due to widespread business reopenings.
8	WHEREAS, On April 19, 2020, President Trump touted that
9	4,180,000 COVID-19 tests have been conducted nationwide; and
10	WHEREAS, That figure represents only 1.27% of the
11	approximately 330 million Americans facing exposure to the novel
12	coronavirus, known as COVID-19; and
13	WHEREAS, The Director of the National Institute of Allergy
14	and Infectious Diseases, Dr. Anthony Fauci, optimistically
15	estimated that the COVID-19 vaccine could be 12 to 18 months
16	from development; and
17	WHEREAS, Consequently, without a robust testing solution to
18	trace and identify individuals who have been exposed to COVID-19
19	or have the antibodies to the virus, citizens of this
20	Commonwealth and our nation as a whole still lack confidence
21	that a broad-based reopening of the economy will not lead to an

increased exposure to COVID-19 and additional sickness and
deaths from COVID-19; and

3 WHEREAS, Many medical professionals agree that without widespread testing for COVID-19, a broad reopening of our 4 nation's economy cannot be done in a safe manner; and 5 6 WHEREAS, Researchers at Harvard University recently suggested 7 that without tripling the daily COVID-19 testing being conducted 8 in the United States during the next month, our nation will be unable to reduce our COVID-19 positive test rate to 10%; and 9 10 WHEREAS, The maximum COVID-19 positive test rate recommended by the World Health Organization is 10%; and 11 12 WHEREAS, The United States is currently averaging 146,000 13 tests per day in the month of April; and 14 WHEREAS, Citizens of this Commonwealth trust that the medical 15 community will use the scientific data necessary to make 16 informed public health decisions when addressing our ability to get back to business in this Commonwealth and throughout our 17 18 country; and

19 WHEREAS, The Federal Government should be partnering with 20 this Commonwealth to procure or provide the necessary materials, including reagents, swabs and antibody and diagnostic testing, 21 to create quantifiable data that can responsibly inform 22 23 decisions regarding this Commonwealth's ability to safely reopen 24 businesses and get Pennsylvanians back to work; and 25 WHEREAS, In the absence of widespread testing for COVID-19, 26 the Commonwealth will be unable to adequately protect Pennsylvanians from potential exposure to COVID-19 when opening 27 28 up sectors of the economy; therefore be it 29 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge the President of the United States, White House staff and Federal public health officials to 30
