## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of September 2022 as "Hunger Action Month" 2 in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, September 2022 has been designated nationwide as
- 4 "Hunger Action Month" to raise awareness of the issue of hunger
- 5 and mobilize the public to help end hunger in America; and
- 6 WHEREAS, According to Feeding America, one in nine
- 7 Pennsylvanians and one in seven children are food insecure; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Food insecurity, the condition of limited or
- 9 uncertain access to adequate food, is associated with numerous
- 10 adverse social and health outcomes and is a critical public
- 11 health issue; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Children who experience hunger have higher levels of
- 13 chronic illness, anxiety, depression and behavioral problems
- 14 than children receiving a well-balanced diet; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Food-insecure older adults are at increased risk of
- 16 a range of physical and mental health conditions and
- 17 hospitalization; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Food insecurity is not discerning of whether
- 2 Pennsylvanians reside in urban or rural communities; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The COVID-19 pandemic exacerbated many of the
- 4 factors that lead to food insecurity; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Current inflation rates for essentials are
- 6 compounding the economic challenges for many Pennsylvanians; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Hunger relief organizations, food banks and food
- 8 pantries throughout this Commonwealth are uniquely positioned to
- 9 help struggling individuals and families make ends meet and are
- 10 critical lifelines for nearly 2 million Pennsylvanians annually
- 11 but are increasingly stretched thin; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The fight against hunger requires engaging a wide
- 13 range of public and private entities, including policymakers,
- 14 business leaders, community activists, concerned citizens and
- 15 food-serving organizations; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Food banks, food rescue organizations, soup
- 17 kitchens, food pantries, faith-based organizations, businesses
- 18 and individuals are donating time, raising funds and giving food
- 19 to help their neighbors; therefore be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the month of September
- 21 2022 as "Hunger Action Month" in Pennsylvania.
