INTRODUCED AND ADOPTED, FEBRUARY 25, 2015

A RESOLUTION

1 Observing March 1, 2015, as "St. David's Day" in Pennsylvania
2 and honoring the many Pennsylvanians of Welsh heritage.

3 WHEREAS, St. David is the patron saint of Wales and March 1,
4 St. David's feast day, is the Welsh National Holiday, which is
5 celebrated by Welsh people throughout the world; and

6 WHEREAS, Starting in the 17th century, a significant number
7 of people emigrated from Wales to Pennsylvania seeking religious
8 freedom and employment; and

9 WHEREAS, William Penn and the Society of Friends, or Quakers,
10 founded the heart of the first Welsh settlement in Philadelphia;
11 and

12 WHEREAS, A second wave of Welsh immigration, led by a Baptist
13 minister, occurred in the 18th century resulting in the
14 immigrants settling in Cambria County; and

15 WHEREAS, Since Pennsylvania and Wales both include rare
16 anthracite coal among their natural resources, many Welsh

1 immigrants also settled in the northeastern Pennsylvania coal
2 region; and

3 WHEREAS, Many Pennsylvania cities and towns are named by or
4 for Welsh people; and

5 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has a concentration of people of Welsh
6 ancestry that is greater than any other state; and

7 WHEREAS, The rich Welsh traditions and culture have had a
8 tremendous impact on Pennsylvania; and

9 WHEREAS, "St. David's Day" unites Welsh people worldwide in
10 the celebration of their identity; therefore be it

11 RESOLVED, That the Senate observe March 1, 2015, as "St.
12 David's Day" in Pennsylvania and honor the many Pennsylvanians
13 of Welsh heritage.
