## A RESOLUTION

Establishing a task force on lead exposure and the hazards of 1 lead poisoning; imposing duties on the Joint State Government 2 Commission; and authorizing a study. 3 4 WHEREAS, Recent events in Flint, Michigan, have brought national attention to lead levels in drinking water; and 5 6 WHEREAS, Based on the 2010 census, Pennsylvania ranks fifth 7 nationally in the percentage of homes built before 1978; and WHEREAS, Based on the 2010 census, Pennsylvania ranks fifth 8 9 nationally in the percentage of homes built before 1950; and 10 WHEREAS, Older homes are significantly more likely to contain 11 lead paint, lead pipes or copper pipes with lead soldering; and 12 WHEREAS, Lead affects virtually every system in the body and 13 is particularly harmful to a child's developing brain and 14 nervous system; therefore be it 15 RESOLVED, That the Senate establish a task force on lead 16 exposure and the hazards of lead poisoning; and be it further

17 RESOLVED, That the task force be comprised of two members of 18 the Senate, one appointed by the President pro tempore and one

appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; and be it 1 2 further 3 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission establish an advisory committee to the task force consisting of 4 the following members: 5 (1) the Secretary of Health, or his or her designee; 6 7 (2) the Secretary of Environmental Protection, or his or her designee; 8 9 the chairperson of the Pennsylvania Public Utility (3) 10 Commission, or his or her designee; 11 (4) the executive director of the Pennsylvania Housing 12 and Finance Agency, or his or her designee; 13 (5) the Physician General for the Commonwealth, or his 14 or her designee; (6) nine individuals appointed by the Governor as 15 16 follows: (i) two individuals who are pediatric doctors with 17 18 experience in lead poisoning; 19 (ii) one individual who is the parent of a child 20 with elevated lead levels; 21 one individual representing municipal water (iii) 22 authorities; 23 (iv) one individual representing rural water 24 companies; 25 (v) one individual representing water companies that 26 are not owned by a municipal water authority or a rural 27 water company; (vi) one individual who is certified to remediate 28 29 lead in this Commonwealth; 30 (vii) one individual who works in maintenance in a 20170SR0033PN0481 - 2 -

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school in an urban school district; and

2 (viii) one individual who works in maintenance in a
3 school in a rural school district.

4 (7) The executive director of the Housing Alliance of
5 Pennsylvania;

6 and be it further

7 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of Health serve as the chairperson of the advisory committee; and be it further 8 9 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission, working 10 with the advisory committee, conduct a comprehensive review and 11 analysis of laws, regulations, policies and procedures of the 12 Commonwealth and other states regarding an assessment of lead exposure as a public health concern; and be it further 13 14 RESOLVED, That the review and analysis include the following 15 areas:

16 (1) an assessment of the age of this Commonwealth's
17 housing stock, public housing units, water pipelines, school
18 buildings and day-care facilities;

19 (2) an assessment of the threat lead exposure poses to20 public health;

(3) an assessment of the prevalence of lead in homes,
schools, day-care centers and other places in which children
spend a majority of their days; and

(4) an assessment of the Commonwealth's approach to lead testing and remediation and how it compares to other states; and be it further

27 RESOLVED, That the task force recommend changes to State 28 statutes, regulations, practices, policies and procedures 29 relating to lead testing and remediation; and be it further 30 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission issue a

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1 report of the task force's findings and recommendations to the

2 Senate within 18 months of the adoption of this resolution.
