## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- Designating Pennsylvania as a Hidden Heroes state in support of military and veteran caregivers.
- 3 WHEREAS, Since World War II, the series of wars and conflicts
- 4 in which our nation has been engaged has resulted in
- 5 approximately 5.5 million military and veteran caregivers who
- 6 are parents, spouses, siblings and friends of those wounded, ill
- 7 or injured as a result of their service to our nation, as
- 8 documented by a 2014 study by the RAND Corporation and the
- 9 Elizabeth Dole Foundation; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The daily tasks of military and veteran caregivers
- 11 may include bathing, feeding, administering medications and
- 12 dressing and caring for the grievous injuries of wounded
- 13 warriors, providing emotional support, caring for the family and
- 14 the home and working outside the home to earn essential income;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, The nation provides multifaceted support to our
- 17 wounded, ill and injured veterans and service members through

- 1 public, private and philanthropic resources, but their
- 2 caregivers receive little support or acknowledgment; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Most military and veteran caregivers consider the
- 4 challenging work they do as simply carrying out their civic and
- 5 patriotic duty, without realizing they are caregivers, and do
- 6 not identify themselves as such; and
- 7 WHEREAS, An alarming number of military and veteran
- 8 caregivers are suffering numerous debilitating mental, physical
- 9 and emotional effects as a result of their caregiving duties;
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth desires to recognize and support
- 12 those who are serving in these vital roles in our communities;
- 13 therefore be it
- RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the
- 15 General Assembly designate Pennsylvania as a Hidden Heroes state
- 16 in support of military and veteran caregivers; and be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Commonwealth seek to identify military and
- 18 veteran caregivers residing in our communities and determine the
- 19 unique challenges that they face; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Commonwealth work to ensure that our
- 21 government, nonprofit and other organizations are aware of the
- 22 unique challenges of military and veteran caregivers; and be it
- 23 further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly encourage nonprofit and
- 25 other organizations to create supportive environments and
- 26 opportunities for assistance for military and veteran
- 27 caregivers; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the Commonwealth plan an annual observance or
- 29 resource fair in partnership with the Elizabeth Dole
- 30 Foundation's national Hidden Heroes campaign to recognize

- 1 communities' military and veteran caregivers and connect them
- 2 with local resources; and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly encourage the residents
- 4 of this Commonwealth to extend their support for veterans and
- 5 service members to their caregivers as well; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Commonwealth designate a point of contact
- 7 for our communities, from the public or private sector, for
- 8 citizens and organizations that want to offer support and for
- 9 caregivers who need that support; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the Commonwealth use the Elizabeth Dole
- 11 Foundation's Military Caregiver Experience Map to understand the
- 12 stages of a military caregiver's journey and use it as a tool to
- 13 encourage community understanding and support.
