## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of October 2 through 8, 2022, as "Voter Education Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The Department of Education declares that young
- 4 people and youth voters in this Commonwealth will be prepared to
- 5 be responsible, involved citizens; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Young people play a critical role in our democracy
- 7 by helping to choose the people who will lead us and voicing
- 8 their opinions on issues that are important to them; and
- 9 WHEREAS, With approximately 179,000 voters turning 18 years
- 10 of age in Pennsylvania each year, youth voters have a
- 11 significant impact on the future of this Commonwealth; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Students are encouraged to participate in our
- 13 democracy through civics classes and activities and voter
- 14 education programs and by encouraging their peers, members of
- 15 their families and communities to register to vote and
- 16 participate in elections; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Increasing civic participation and voter turnout by
- 18 young people are critical in bringing resources and funding to

- 1 provide the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient
- 2 system of public education to serve the needs of this
- 3 Commonwealth; and
- WHEREAS, Under 25 Pa.C.S. § 1327(c)(2), voter registration
- 5 materials are required to be made available to every public
- 6 school; and
- 7 WHEREAS, To comply with the National Voter Registration Act,
- 8 Pennsylvania schools are required to provide voter registration
- 9 as a part of Individualized Education Programs for students 17
- 10 years of age or older to assist in their transition to adult
- 11 life; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Schools may also comply with this Federal
- 13 requirement by providing general school-wide registration
- 14 programs offering voter registration opportunities, registration
- 15 forms and assistance to all students approaching voting age; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Department of State presents the Governor's
- 17 Civic Engagement Award to a school that registers at least 65%
- 18 of eligible student voters for the Silver Award and 85% for the
- 19 Gold Award; and
- 20 WHEREAS, According to Pew Research, only 6% of students
- 21 nationally were asked to register to vote in school; and
- 22 WHEREAS, It takes a permanent, organized and concerted year-
- 23 round commitment in every school to identify, register and
- 24 educate eligible students to become informed voters; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Research shows that if young voters cast a ballot in
- 26 two consecutive elections they are more likely to become
- 27 habitual lifetime voters; and
- 28 WHEREAS, If young people fail to register or vote in their
- 29 first election, they are more likely to disengage for another
- 30 decade and will only return to voting in their 30s; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Because of COVID-19, voter registration efforts
- 2 aimed at young people have been especially challenging due to
- 3 closures of schools and government offices and the cancellation
- 4 of public events; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The spread of disinformation and conspiracy theories
- 6 have led to racist acts of domestic terrorism and attacks on the
- 7 Federal Government and on the institution of democracy itself;
- 8 therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of October 2
- 10 through 8, 2022, as "Voter Education Week" in Pennsylvania.
