A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the importance of ensuring access to technology and information for individuals with cognitive disabilities.
- 3 WHEREAS, Approximately 28 million people in the United States
- 4 have cognitive disabilities, such as intellectual disabilities,
- 5 persistent mental illness, brain injury, stroke and
- 6 neurodegenerative disorders, including Alzheimer's disease; and
- 7 WHEREAS, People with cognitive disabilities are entitled to
- 8 inclusion in our democratic society under Federal laws, such as
- 9 the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the Developmental
- 10 Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act of 2000, the
- 11 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and section 504 of
- 12 the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and under various State and
- 13 local laws; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The convergence of computing and communication
- 15 technologies has substantially altered how people acquire,
- 16 utilize and disseminate knowledge and information; and
- 17 WHEREAS, People with cognitive disabilities must have access

- 1 to commercially available devices and software that incorporate
- 2 principles of universal design, such as flexibility and ease of
- 3 use for all; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Technology and information access by people with
- 5 cognitive disabilities must be guided by standards and best
- 6 practices, such as personalization and compatibility access
- 7 devices and platforms and through the application of innovation,
- 8 including automated and predictive technologies; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Security and privacy must be assured and managed to
- 10 protect civil rights and personal dignity of people with
- 11 cognitive disabilities; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Enhanced public and private funding is urgently
- 13 required to allow people with cognitive disabilities to utilize
- 14 technology and access information as a part of their right to
- 15 inclusion in our society; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Strong public policies help to guarantee access to
- 17 technology and information for people with cognitive
- 18 disabilities and their families; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Ensuring access to technology and information for
- 20 the 28 million people with cognitive disabilities in the United
- 21 States will create new markets and employment opportunities,
- 22 decrease dependency on public services, reduce healthcare costs
- 23 and improve the independence, productivity and quality of life
- 24 for people with cognitive disabilities; therefore be it
- 25 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the importance of
- 26 ensuring access to technology and information for individuals
- 27 with cognitive disabilities; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the Senate affirm our commitment to equal
- 29 rights for people with cognitive disabilities to technology and
- 30 information access and call for implementation of such rights

- 1 with deliberate speed; and be it further
- 2 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 3 the Governor of Pennsylvania and to each member of Congress from
- 4 Pennsylvania.
