A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating October 20, 2022, as "Lights on Afterschool Day" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, The residents of this Commonwealth stand firmly
4	committed to quality afterschool programs and opportunities
5	because these programs and opportunities:
6	(1) provide safe and engaging learning experiences that
7	help children realize their full potential;
8	(2) support working families by ensuring that their
9	children are safe and productive when they are out of their
10	classrooms;
11	(3) build stronger communities by involving students,
12	parents, business leaders and adult volunteers in the lives
13	of young people, thereby promoting positive relationships
14	among youth, families and adults; and
15	(4) engage families, schools and community partners in
16	advancing the welfare of our children;

1 WHEREAS, Afterschool programs have risen to the moment to 2 support youth in addressing the social and academic needs as 3 they recover from the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, Afterschool programs continue to provide innovative, hands-on opportunities for youth to reengage in their learning and connect with caring adults and peers in a safe and supportive environment; and

8 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has provided significant 9 leadership in the area of community involvement in the education 10 and well-being of our youth, grounded in the principle that 11 quality afterschool programs are key to helping our children 12 become successful adults; and

13 WHEREAS, The National "Lights On Afterschool" celebration of 14 afterschool programs, held this year on October 20, 2022, 15 promotes the importance of quality afterschool programs in the 16 lives of children, families and communities; and

WHEREAS, Nearly 25 million families report that they would enroll their child in an afterschool program if one were available; and

20 WHEREAS, For students in kindergarten through twelfth grade, more than 80% of their time is spent learning outside school 21 during afterschool and summer programs, in libraries, museums 22 23 and science centers or at home or in the community; and 24 WHEREAS, Afterschool programs engage students in hands-on, 25 real world science, technology, engineering and mathematics 26 (STEM) projects to help build vital 21st-century skills, cultivate an interest in STEM and offer innovative ways for 27 28 students to connect STEM to their lives and community; and 29 WHEREAS, Many afterschool programs across the country are 30 facing operating challenges so severe that they are forced to

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1 consider closing their doors and turning off their lights; and 2 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth is committed to investing in the 3 health and safety of all young people by providing expanded 4 learning opportunities that help our children learn and grow, 5 while helping them develop the skills essential for success in 6 life and work; therefore be it

7 RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the 8 General Assembly designate October 20, 2022, as "Lights On 9 Afterschool Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further 10 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly commit this Commonwealth 11 to engage in innovative afterschool programs and activities that 12 ensure the lights stay on and the doors stay open for all 13 children after school.

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
