A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February 15, 2023, as "International Childhood Cancer Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, "International Childhood Cancer Day" increases
- 4 awareness of children fighting pediatric cancer across the
- 5 globe; and
- 6 WHEREAS, "International Childhood Cancer Day" honors those
- 7 children who lost their battle with cancer; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Cancer is one of the leading causes of death among
- 9 children; and
- 10 WHEREAS, According to the "International Childhood Cancer
- 11 Day" organization, a child battling pediatric cancer dies every
- 12 three minutes; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The rate of children diagnosed with cancer has
- 14 increased since the 1970s; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The most recent data provided by the International
- 16 Agency for Research on Cancer estimated that in 2020
- 17 approximately 280,000 children and adolescents were diagnosed

- 1 with cancer; and
- 2 WHEREAS, In 2020, the International Agency for Research on
- 3 Cancer reported approximately 110,000 pediatric cancer
- 4 fatalities; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The number of pediatric cancer cases is likely
- 6 higher than what is currently reported due to the lack of
- 7 registries in countries across the globe; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Children from impoverished countries lack access to
- 9 medicines and treatment that could save their lives; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The five-year survival rate among children diagnosed
- 11 with cancer is approximately 85%; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The survival rate depends heavily on the type of
- 13 cancer and other factors; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Due to children's bodies still growing and cancer
- 15 treatments largely geared toward use on adults, children are
- 16 more likely to experience long-term side effects from treatment;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, Possible late effects of cancer treatments include
- 19 heart or lung problems, slowed or delayed development, changes
- 20 in sexual development and the ability to have children, learning
- 21 disabilities and increased risk of secondary forms of cancer;
- 22 and
- 23 WHEREAS, According to the American Childhood Cancer
- 24 Organization, pediatric cancer patients enter clinical trials
- 25 more often than adult patients; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Despite advancing treatments and decreasing
- 27 mortality rates, cancer remains the number one disease
- 28 associated with childhood deaths; therefore be it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize February 15, 2023, as
- 30 "International Childhood Cancer Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it

- 2 RESOLVED, That the Senate celebrate its progress and the
- 3 progress of all related organizations in aiding children
- 4 battling childhood cancer while simultaneously renewing its
- 5 commitment to the cause; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage young Pennsylvanians who
- 7 are fighting cancer, honor young people who have lost their
- 8 lives to childhood cancer, express gratitude to the doctors,
- 9 nurses and parents who provide special care to patients and
- 10 families affected by childhood cancer and encourage all
- 11 residents in this Commonwealth to join the fight against
- 12 childhood cancer.
