A RESOLUTION

1 2	Recognizing the week of November 14 through 20, 2022, as "National Apprenticeship Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, The year 2022 marks the 85th anniversary of the
4	National Apprenticeship Act; and
5	WHEREAS, The year 2022 marks the 61st anniversary of the
6	Pennsylvania Apprenticeship and Training Act; and
7	WHEREAS, The advancement and well-being of Pennsylvania
8	depends upon its ability to expand opportunities in its
9	workforce; and
10	WHEREAS, Apprenticeship programs enable employers to develop
11	and train the future workforce while offering career seekers
12	affordable paths to secure high-paying jobs; and
13	WHEREAS, Apprenticeship programs are available in many
14	fields, including manufacturing, education, construction, health
15	care, oil and gas extraction, finance and hospitality; and
16	WHEREAS, Apprenticeships continue to serve a vital role in
17	the occupational development of Pennsylvanians every year; and

WHEREAS, In 2022, 16,576 registered apprentices practiced
their trade in Pennsylvania; and

3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania had 1,596 active apprenticeship4 programs in 2022; and

WHEREAS, According to the Department of Labor and Industry, 5 94% of apprentices who complete their apprenticeship retain 6 employment with an average annual salary of \$70,000; and 7 8 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth recognizes that apprenticeship, a proven training model, can develop our workforce and build a 9 path into good, quality jobs in order to address our State's and 10 nation's pressing workforce challenges; therefore be it 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the week of November 14 12 through 20, 2022, as "National Apprenticeship Week" in 13 14 Pennsylvania.
