## A RESOLUTION

Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to 1 conduct a study and issue a report making recommendations for 2 initiatives to assist dairy producers in this Commonwealth. 3 4 WHEREAS, Years of lower milk prices and decreasing sales of packaged beverage milk products have placed dairy producers in 5 this Commonwealth and others across the country under severe 7 financial stress; and 8 WHEREAS, Many dairy producers in this Commonwealth and across the country are forced to borrow against the equity in 10 their farm to continue the dairy operations; and WHEREAS, Due to these factors, the typical response to lower 11 milk prices, increasing production to increase revenue, no 12 13 longer provides sufficient economic relief and overall may add 14 to a milk surplus, adversely affecting the prices that the 15 producer receives; and WHEREAS, Increasingly, dairy producers are forced to leave 16 dairy production due to the financial stress; therefore be it 17

RESOLVED, That the Senate direct the Legislative Budget and

- 4 and decreasing milk prices; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 6 identify the measures proposed or undertaken by the Pennsylvania
- 7 Milk Marketing Board and the Pennsylvania Department of
- 8 Agriculture to assist dairy producers in this Commonwealth; and
- 9 be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 11 identify and examine the statutes, best practices and proposed
- 12 measures of other states to assist their dairy producers during
- 13 these economic times; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 15 identify current factors that contribute to the decrease in
- 16 dairy product consumption and milk prices; and be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 18 identify the number and types of specialty dairy products, such
- 19 as lactose-free milk, that are sold in this Commonwealth by out-
- 20 of-state dairy producers and examine how milk produced in this
- 21 Commonwealth can be utilized to meet the increased demand for
- 22 this specialty dairy products market; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 24 examine the testimony submitted at the public hearings held by
- 25 the Pennsylvania Milk Marketing Board regarding the Pennsylvania
- 26 dairy market; and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 28 report all findings and conclusions on this issue to the Senate
- 29 within 12 months of the adoption of this resolution.
