A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating March 21, 2021, as "World Down Syndrome Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Down syndrome is a genetic condition that occurs in
- 4 approximately 1 in 1,100 live births worldwide according to the
- 5 World Health Organization; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Down Syndrome occurs in approximately 1 in 700 live
- 7 births in the Untied States according to the Centers for Disease
- 8 Control and prevention; and
- 9 WHEREAS, It is difficult to determine the number of
- 10 individuals currently living with Down syndrome worldwide,
- 11 however, some sources estimate the number to be more than 6
- 12 million; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The most common form of Down syndrome, trisomy 21,
- 14 is due to an error in cell division, just prior to or during
- 15 conception, with the 21st chromosome dividing in three instead
- 16 of two, resulting in a person being born with 47 instead of 46
- 17 chromosomes in each cell; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Early intervention, appropriate speech, physical and
- 2 occupational therapies and quality education programs enable
- 3 individuals with Down syndrome to adapt and thrive; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Thanks to advances in medical treatments and
- 5 continuing research, life expectancy for individuals with Down
- 6 syndrome worldwide has increased dramatically, with a large
- 7 majority living beyond 50 years of age; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Individuals with Down syndrome consistently prove
- 9 their ability to overcome obstacles; and
- 10 WHEREAS, With interventions and programs and the support of
- 11 family and community, individuals with Down syndrome attend
- 12 school and participate in postsecondary opportunities, with many
- 13 going on to college, obtaining full-time employment, entering
- 14 into marriage and fully participating in their communities; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Individuals living with Down syndrome have excelled
- 16 in various fields, including becoming global influencers,
- 17 fashion designers, lobbyists, accomplished musicians, teachers,
- 18 leaders of large nonprofits and small business entrepreneurs;
- 19 therefore be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate March 21, 2021, as "World
- 21 Down Syndrome Day" in Pennsylvania; and be further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the numerous
- 23 contributions that individuals with Down syndrome and their
- 24 families make not only in our great Commonwealth, but across the
- 25 globe.
