## A RESOLUTION

- Urging the Congress of the United States to enact Federal 1 legislation pending in the United States Senate to prevent 2 the separation of children from their parents at the border 3 and keep immigrant families together. 5 WHEREAS, The Trump Administration and United States Attorney General Jeff Sessions have adopted a "zero-tolerance" policy and 6 announced criminal prosecutions regarding individuals who cross 7 the border seeking protections from violence; and 8 WHEREAS, The "zero-tolerance" policy requires the separation 9 10 of children from those individuals who are detained since 11 children cannot be jailed; and WHEREAS, The Trump Administration has cited Federal law as 12 the reason for the separations, even though no statutes exist 13 that require children to be physically separated from their 14
- 16 WHEREAS, The Trump Administration began interpreting a 1997
- 17 legal agreement and a 2008 human trafficking bill as requiring
- 18 the physical separation of families; and

parents; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Neither the administrations of former President
- 2 George W. Bush nor Barack Obama adopted this interpretation of
- 3 those agreements; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The Trump Administration's unilateral change in
- 5 policy has resulted in more than 2,000 children being physically
- 6 separated from their parents over a six-week period, with more
- 7 than 100 of those separated children being younger than 4 years
- 8 of age, according to the Department of Homeland Security figures
- 9 cited by numerous media; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In one facility in Texas, more than 1,100
- 11 undocumented migrants were detained with 200 of those detainees
- 12 being unaccompanied children; and
- 13 WHEREAS, There have been widespread reports and photographic
- 14 evidence of children being housed in fenced-in shelters or
- 15 makeshift facilities; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Trump Administration policy has been roundly
- 17 criticized by Democrats, Republicans, clergy, advocates and
- 18 others as cruel, harsh, immoral and inhumane; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The United Nations Human Rights Office of the High
- 20 Commissioner condemned the practice of separating immigrant and
- 21 refugee children from their parents at the border as "a serious
- 22 violation of the rights of the child" on June 5, 2018; and
- WHEREAS, Senator Diane Feinstein, on June 7, 2018, introduced
- 24 S. 3036, known as the "Keep Families Together Act," to prevent
- 25 the United States Department of Homeland Security from
- 26 separating immigrant children from their parents at the border,
- 27 and similar legislation is pending before Congress; therefore be
- 28 it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 30 urge Congress to enact Federal legislation pending in the United

- 1 States Senate to prevent the separation of children from their
- 2 parents at the border and keep immigrant families together; and
- 3 be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 condemn the Trump Administration's "zero-tolerance" policy; and
- 6 be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 urge the Pennsylvania delegation to the 115th Congress to
- 9 immediately request that the President reverse his ill-advised
- 10 "zero-tolerance" policy separating children from their families;
- 11 and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 13 the President of the United States, to the presiding officers of
- 14 each house of Congress and to each member of Congress from
- 15 Pennsylvania.
