## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of September 2018 as "Mushroom Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, American mushroom farming began on a farm in Chester
- 4 County, now recognized as the "Mushroom Capital of the World";
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has a growing and productive mushroom
- 7 agribusiness in many parts of this Commonwealth; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Thanks to its 68 mushroom farms, Pennsylvania leads
- 9 the nation in mushroom production; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania growers produced 577 million pounds of
- 11 mushrooms in the last growing season with an estimated value of
- 12 \$560 million; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's mushroom producers supplied 65% of
- 14 the white, brown and specialty varieties grown in the United
- 15 States in the 2016-2017 growing season; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's mushroom farms are family owned and
- 17 operated, some for as many as four generations; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Mushrooms are one of the most difficult commodities
- 2 to grow due to the intensive labor required to produce a
- 3 consistent, high-quality crop; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Modern mushroom farms are highly technical
- 5 operations that utilize computerized systems to monitor
- 6 production and safety; and
- WHEREAS, Mushroom growers carefully prepare compost, generate
- 8 an indoor pasteurization process, control temperature and
- 9 humidity and harvest their crop thanks to advancements in
- 10 technology; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The mushroom industry contributes to the
- 12 preservation of this Commonwealth's agricultural customs and
- 13 traditions; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The success of the mushroom industry greatly
- 15 contributes to the economies of Chester County and this
- 16 Commonwealth while preserving this Commonwealth's agricultural
- 17 traditions and customs; therefore be it
- 18 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of September
- 19 2018 as "Mushroom Month" in Pennsylvania in recognition of
- 20 Pennsylvania's thriving agriculture industry, and encourage all
- 21 residents to acknowledge and celebrate the achievements of the
- 22 mushroom industry to produce an abundant, profitable mushroom
- 23 crop, recognized for superior quality and its significance to
- 24 this Commonwealth's economy.
