A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing September 2014 as "Hunger Action Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, September 2014 has been designated as Hunger Action
- 4 Month to provide an opportunity for communities in the United
- 5 States to unite to focus attention on the persistent problem of
- 6 domestic hunger; and
- 7 WHEREAS, According to Feeding Pennsylvania, 1.82 million
- 8 Pennsylvanians fight hunger, including approximately 536,000
- 9 children who are nutritionally insecure; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Agriculture gathers
- 11 information and provides statistics related to domestic hunger;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, Hunger is a reality for one in seven Pennsylvanians;
- 14 and
- 15 WHEREAS, Many United States households experience hunger and
- 16 some people in these households frequently skip meals or eat too

- 1 little, sometimes going without food for a whole day; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Members of these households have lower-quality diets
- 3 or must resort to seeking emergency food because they cannot
- 4 always afford the food they need; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The costs of other essentials, such as home heating,
- 6 gasoline, housing and medical care have increased significantly,
- 7 and for families caught in the squeeze between declining wages
- 8 and rising costs, the food budget becomes a frequent pressure
- 9 point; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Utilization of emergency food assistance becomes a
- 11 way for these families to keep food on the table while still
- 12 paying the bills; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Food banks, food rescue organizations, soup
- 14 kitchens, food pantries, faith-based organizations, businesses
- 15 and individuals are donating time, raising funds and giving food
- 16 to help their neighbors; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Individuals benefiting from the availability of
- 18 donated food range from infants and toddlers, school-age
- 19 children and adolescents to single mothers, single fathers, two-
- 20 parent families, veterans and their families and seniors;
- 21 therefore be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize September 2014 as "Hunger
- 23 Action Month" in Pennsylvania.
