## A RESOLUTION

Designating the month of September 2018 as "#UTILITYCAREERS 1 Month" in Pennsylvania. 2 3 WHEREAS, Utility providers in this Commonwealth bring vital services to our homes and businesses; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Utility employment represents tens of thousands of 6 community-oriented jobs with good wages, career growth and 7 training opportunities and the satisfaction of knowing that you are serving your neighbors; and 8 9 WHEREAS, There is a strong need for additional skilled 10 utility workers across our nation and in this Commonwealth due 11 to a combination of factors, including an aging current 12 workforce and the growth of new systems and technologies; and 13 WHEREAS, Utility employment in this Commonwealth is growing 14 faster and wages are substantially higher than other employment 15 sectors; and

16 WHEREAS, The average wage for a utility worker in this 17 Commonwealth is just over \$93,000 per year, which is nearly 18 twice the average wage for other employment sectors; and 1 WHEREAS, The number of utility jobs has increased by more 2 than 11% over the past five years in this Commonwealth, which is 3 five times the job growth compared to other employment sectors; 4 and

5 WHEREAS, There is a nationwide and Statewide need for all of 6 the following skilled utility personnel:

7 (1) engineers;

8 (2) field operators who maintain existing systems and
9 build-out new systems;

10 (3) plant operators who keep the energy and water 11 flowing to our communities; and

12 (4) various technical experts, including cybersecurity13 experts;

14 and

WHEREAS, Nationally, utility providers are expected to hire an additional 70,000 workers by 2020 and growth in the energy sector alone is expected to create an estimated 1.5 million jobs by 2030; and

19 WHEREAS, Utility providers ensure that the residents of this 20 Commonwealth are safe and healthy; and

21 WHEREAS, It is important to ensure that utility providers 22 have the skilled personnel they need to meet the needs of today 23 and tomorrow; and

24 WHEREAS, It is essential for utility providers, State 25 agencies, educational institutions and other concerned parties 26 to work collaboratively to develop a skilled and diverse 27 workforce to support these essential services; therefore be it 28 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of September 29 2018 as "#UTILITYCAREERS Month" in Pennsylvania in recognition 30 of the effort to increase access to information about utility
